Preparation of Whitewash. As this is the season for whitewashing we copy the following recipe from one of our exchanges, and would say that, so far as our experience goes, the receipt recommended is the best we have ever met with.

Whitewash is one of the most valuable articles in the world when properly applied. It prevents not only the decay of wood, but also conducts greatly to the healthiness of all buildings, whether wood or stone.

Take a clean, water-tight barrel, or other suitable cask, and put into it half a bushel of lime. Slack it by pouring water on it, being hot, and in sufficient quantity to cover it five inches deep, and stir it briskly till the lumps are broken.

When the slacking has been effected, dissolve it in water, and add two pounds of sulphate of zinc and one of common salt. These will cause the wash to harden and prevent its cracking, which gives an appearance of solidity to the work.
