STATE OF MARYLAND, EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT.

PROCLAMATION.

Whereas by the Constitution of Maryland article 14, section 1, providing for amendments to the Constitution, it is made the duty of the Governor to order the publication of the bill proposing amendments therein directed.

CHAPTER 417.

AN ACT to amend section five of article four of the Constitution of this State.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Maryland, that the members of the two Houses concurring, that the following section be and the same is hereby proposed for an amendment to the constitution of this State, and it adopted by the legal and qualified voters thereof as herein provided, it shall supersede and stand in the place and stead of section five of article four of said constitution.

Section 2. After the election for Judge as hereinafter provided, the said section shall be in force in this State, in every fifth year thereafter, on the Tuesday after the first Monday in November of each year, an election for Judge as herein provided, and in case of death, resignation, removal or disqualification, by reason of age or otherwise, of any Judge, the Governor shall appoint an individual to fill the said office, who shall hold the same until the next general election for members of the General Assembly, when a successor shall be named as hereinafter provided; and upon the expiration of the term of three years for which any Judge is elected, he shall be eligible for re-election, and his successors shall take place at the next general election for members of the General Assembly to be held on the Tuesday after the first Monday in November of each year, and the Governor shall appoint a person duly qualified to hold said office from the expiration of such term of three years until the election and qualification of his successor.

Section 3. And be it further enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Maryland, that the foregoing section hereby proposed as an amendment to the constitution shall be, at the next general election to be held in this State, submitted to the legal and qualified voters thereof for their adoption or rejection in pursuance of the directions contained in article fourteen of the constitution of this State, and at the said general election the vote on said proposed amendment to the constitution shall be by ballot, and upon each ballot shall be written or printed the words "for the constitutional amendment," or "against the constitutional amendment," as the voters shall elect, and immediately after said election the result shall be made known to the Governor of the vote for and against said proposed amendment, as directed by the said fourteen article of the constitution.

Now, therefore, I WILLIAM T. HAMILTON, Governor of the State of Maryland, do hereby order that the said act of Assembly proposing an amendment to the Constitution as aforesaid be published in two newspapers to be designated in each county where so many may be published, in the German language, once a week for at least three months preceding the general election to be held on the 8th day of November next.

Given under my hand and the great seal of the State at the city of Annapolis, this 7th day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.
