

PUBLIC LOCAL LAWS

For Charles County

PASSED AT JANUARY SESSION, 1884.

Published by Authority.

CHAPTER 124.

AN ACT to permit the catching of Terrapins in the waters of the Patuxent river and its tributaries, lying within the counties of Calvert, St. Mary's and Charles.

Sec. 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That on and after the passage of this act, it shall be lawful for the bona-fide citizens of Calvert, St. Mary's and Charles counties, to catch terrapins in the waters of the Patuxent river and its tributaries in said counties, between the first day of September in each and every year, until the first day of June next succeeding.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That no one but bona-fide citizens of Calvert, St. Mary's and Charles counties, shall catch terrapins in the waters of the Patuxent river and its tributaries in said counties, and that any person or persons violating the above sections of this act shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof before any justice of the peace for Calvert, St. Mary's and Charles counties, shall be fined not less than five nor more than two hundred dollars, one-half to be paid to the informer and the other half to the county commissioners of the county of which the justice of the peace having jurisdiction and trying the case is a resident, for the use and benefit of public schools of said county.

Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That the boat and seine, or any other instrument used by or found in the possession of any person or persons violating the preceding sections of this act, shall be responsible for the same.

Sec. 4. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage. Approved March 31, 1884.

CHAPTER 79.

AN ACT to authorize and direct the County Commissioners of Charles county to pay to Edward L. Hunt the sum of eleven dollars and seventy-five cents, for money paid for crow bills during the years eighteen hundred and eighty-two and eighteen hundred and eighty-three.

Sec. 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the county commissioners of Charles county are hereby authorized and directed to pay to Edward L. Hunt, of said county, the sum of eleven dollars and seventy-five cents, out of any money that may be in their hands not otherwise appropriated, to refund to him money paid by him for crow bills during the years eighteen hundred and eighty-two and eighteen hundred and eighty-three.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage. Approved March 30, 1884.
