Give your horse the gold and silver power...

If there is a place in the harvest field that requires a trusty hand, it is in shearing grain.

The first grain of wheat, oats, barley or other grain that appears above the surface is the only one that the soil produces.

The first requisite in the successful management of harvest is to have the best of machinery, and keep it in good running order.

A heifer's first calf is not apt to be as good as its successors, especially in these days when so many heifers are bred too young.

Wool and mutton are bound together inseparably if either would be made most permanently profitable, and he who attempts to separate them is foolish.

The English remedy for worms in the lungs of sheep is to shut the animals affected in a close room and require them to inhale the fumes of sulphur.

Seed of oats or barley should always be plump and heavy, as this produces strong plants, which tiller freely.

After calves get so they will eat hay give them what they will eat clean of this and about one quart of oats daily.

Of course more care is required in feeding concentrated food, grain or meal, than in feeding hay, but to the extent they can be used the more concentrated foods are cheapest.

There is altogether too little enterprize among farmers in hunting up new ideas. Visiting a wide awake young farmer lately, we found he had been using ground rye mixed with wheat bran as food for his horses.

The time for cutting or harvesting timothy depends on what it is to be fed to. If it is for sheep it should be cut just after it is out of blossom and when the seed is formed.

All the profit in farming comes from maximum crops. From the statistics, as shown by the census reports of the United States, it appears that the average yield of the corn crop is about thirty bushels per acre.
