SHERIFF'S ELECTION NOTICE.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to the Qualified Voters of Charles County that an Election will be held on the 1st Tuesday after the 1st Monday of November.

In the several Election Districts of said county as follows: First District—Port Tobacco, Second District—Hill Top, Third District—Crown Point, Fourth District—Allens' Fresh, Fifth District—Harris' Lot, Sixth District—Middleton, Seventh District—Bryantown, Eighth District—Bryantown, Ninth District—Patuxent City.

One person to be Governor, One person to be Comptroller of the Treasury, Three to be Attorneys General, One to be State Attorney, One to be Sheriff, Five to be County Commissioners, One to be Surveyor.

The polls for said Election will be opened in each and every Election District of said county at the usual places of holding the polls, at 10 o'clock A. M., and will close at 6 o'clock P. M., when the ballots shall be opened and publicly counted.

To Hotel Keepers and Others who Deal in Liquors.

FOR THE INFORMATION OF ALL PERSONS CONCERNED, the following Act of the Legislature, passed March 24th, 1865, is published: CHAPTER 191.

AN ACT prohibiting the sale of spirituous or fermented liquors in the several counties of the State on the day of election.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That it shall not be lawful for the keeper of any hotel, tavern, saloon, drinking establishment, or any other place where liquors are sold, or for any person or persons, directly or indirectly, to sell, furnish, give, or cause to be given, any spirituous or fermented liquors, ale, beer, or intoxicating drinks of any kind, on the day of election, to be held in any of the several counties of this State.

SECTION 2. And be it enacted, That any person violating the provisions of this Act shall be liable to indictment by the Grand Jury of the county where the offence is committed, and shall, upon conviction, be fined any sum of money not exceeding fifty dollars, or be fined a sum not less than fifty dollars nor more than one hundred dollars for each and every offence; and the fine shall be paid the informer, the other half to the County Commissioners, for the use of public roads.

SECTION 3. Any person offending against the preceding section, shall be liable to indictment in the Circuit Court, if the offence be committed in any county, or in the Criminal Court of Baltimore, and on conviction, shall be fined not less than fifty nor more than five hundred dollars, to be paid to the State for the use of the School fund.

SECTION 4. Every deposit of money in any part of the State, as a wager or bet upon elections in this State, or elsewhere, shall be forfeited and paid over to the County Commissioners of the county where deposited for the use of the county, and if deposited in the City of Baltimore, to the Mayor and City Council.


