
"Mr. Slowboy's unreciprocated bill will do for Mr. Slowboy," replied the old lady, sternly.—Harper's Magazine.



"What did Santa Claus bring you down the chimney on Christmas?" asked Uncle William of his little nephew Tommy.


"Uncle, I am surprised that a person of your age should still believe in such childish things," was the reply of the little fellow, who will be 5 years old on his next birthday.
