## NEWS IN MINNESOTA

Nineteen naval recruits have been enlisted at St. Paul.

Five new postal stations will be established in St. Paul.

Census examinations will be held in St. Paul in September.

Night dockmen at Two Harbors have struck for \$2 per night.

A new paper, The News, will make its appearance at Ackley this week.

The grand commandery of Minnesota Knights Templar met at Duluth Saturday.

J. A. Herrick, late of the Farmington Tribune, has purchased The Gazette at Exeter, N. H.

State tax collections in the June settlement show an increase over last year of 9 per cent.

Norwegian Lutherans laid the cornerstone of the Theological seminary at Hamline Friday.

The State Horticultural society held its annual meeting at the state farm beginning Thursday.

The State Medical society has closed its annual convention at Minneapolis. The next meeting will be at Duluth.

The strike at the Two Harbors ore docks has been settled and the men returned to work. Their demands were granted.

The Methodist camp meeting for the Watertown (S. D.) and Willmar districts, is being held at Simpson Park, Ortonville.

J. Adam Bede announces that he is a candidate for the Republican congressional nomination in the Sixth district to succeed Congressman Page Morris.

Governor Lind has appointed Alois Schwab a special judge of the municipal court at Le Sueur in accordance with the law passed by the recent legislature.

Governor Lind has received a cable dispatch from Major Bean announcing the death at Manila of Private William Pilgrim, Company A, Thirtieth Minnesota.

At the class day exercises at the Winona normal school the dress of one of the girls caught fire and she was quite painfully, though not dangerously burned.

The state railway commission has asked the courts to enforce the Duluth-New Ulm coal rate. Mandamus proceedings were commenced Friday at St. Paul.

The death is reported of Fred Fritzon of Company E, Thirtieth, by a cablegram from Major Bean to Governor Lind, from typhoid fever. Fritzon was a single man, was 20 years old, a barber, living in St. Paul.

At Duluth the managers of St. Luke's hospital have decided to erect a new hospital building. The new building will cost \$30,000, and the pavilion plan will be adopted. The structure will accommodate 100 patients.

Big Stone Lake Interstate Chautauqua has been established at Simpson park, Ortonville, where it will be held annually hereafter. It will open July 14 and continue until July 31. Elaborate preparations have been arranged.

The receiver of the Marine National Bank of Duluth has advised the controller's office that the affairs of the bank are in such a condition that he will be able to relinquish the receivership within the next two months.

Dr. Ohage, health commissioner at St. Paul, reports that the city has finished with the smallpox patients. The pesthouse has been cleaned and fumigated and the one patient who had the disease during May has been discharged.

The state board of pharmacy has won its case against the Hansen Drug company of Minneapolis. The company had been brought into court upon complaint of the board for permitting the sale of medicines and poisons by an unregistered clerk.

Warden Wolfer, President Nelson and F. W. Temple of the board of prison managers have gone East to purchase additional machinery for the prison twine plant. The new purchase will embrace about \$20,000 worth of new carding machines, spinners, etc.

The Minnesota river at Carver has been rising until now it is out of its banks, and no signs of its falling for a few days. Many acres of sugar beets are under water and the entire celery farms have been abandoned, where thousands of plants were set out.

Mrs. James McIlrath of St. Paul, who is perhaps the best known cyclonee in the Northwest, Sunday finished a "quint" century. She made the run of 500 miles in 58 hours and 45 minutes, which is said to be the world's record, and she is probably the only woman in the Northwest that has accomplished the feat.

A couple of women, one quite aged, and infirm and the other a woman of about 50, have secured a good deal of money from Minneapolis merchants, to whom they represented that the elder woman is a victim of the New Richmond cyclone. It is represented that the old woman lost all her relatives and her building. The women present a letter purporting to be from Mayor Gray. The letter is a forgery.

At the festivities of the 81st annual council of the Ojibwas of Minnesota at White Earth, a fine programme was carried out. Over 1,000 Indians took part in the parade, including about 200 Sioux. Had the weather been favorable, it is estimated that upward of 10,000 people would have been present at different portions of the state. A splendid programme was rendered by the young girls, scholars from St. Benedict's Orphan and industrial school.
