Skobelev Before Constantinople. New Will You Smell—An Army in Danger.

Frederic Villiers, the famous war artist, in an autobiographical sketch contributed to a London periodical, gives this picturesque description of his last meeting with General Skobelev: "He was far and away the most brilliant soldier I ever met; a man with mad ideas and sane execution. The last time I saw him was when the Russian army faced Constantinople, a splendid instance of the survival of the fittest, 30,000 grim warriors who had come through the terrible Russo-Turkish campaign under Skobelev, ready at a moment's notice to occupy the city of sultans. It was a gray afternoon. The general stood outside his tent, bareheaded, scalp shaven like a Mussulman, flowing yellow beard blown about by the wind. I had arrived from Constantinople to bid farewell to him, as I had been ordered to Malta to meet the Indian contingent. Skobelev said to me: "Not goodbye, Villiers, but au revoir. We shall meet again, but how? Will
