Kemp Loses Damage Suit.

The supreme court decided against C. W. Kemp in his suit to recover damages from the Northern Pacific railway company. Mr. Kemp was injured while going with a load of hay across the track in the south of the city. In the lower court Mr. Kemp got a verdict for \$635. The supreme court syllabus is as follows:
C. W. Kemp, respondent, vs. Northern Pacific Railway Company, appellant.

In an action for injuries from collision with a train received while driving over an alleged defective crossing held, that the condition of the crossing was not the proximate cause of the injury, but that respondent was guilty of contributory negligence, and appellant was entitled to judgment notwithstanding the verdict.

Order reversed.

NEW RULE OF TEACHER'S CERTIFICATES.

J. W. Olson, as secretary of the State High school board, has notified all schools under supervision of the board that after July 31st, 1903, no teacher will be accepted by the board as qualified to teach in the grades of any school drawing special aid as a state graded school or as a high school, who has not at least a second grade certificate. No teacher shall be deemed qualified to teach above the sixth grade in such schools who has not at least a first grade certificate.

The rule will not be enforced against teachers who have been employed heretofore in grade work in schools under the supervision of the board. They may continue grade work in the school district in which they have been employed, if they hold second grade certificates or equivalents, on the recommendation of the city superintendent or graded school inspector and the State inspector.

MUST RELINQUISH TITLE TO LAND.

Judge Baxter, of Fergus Falls, has handed down a decision in the case of Louisa M. Aldrich vs. Elsie Angus, in which he finds for the plaintiff. The case is interesting in that it involves a question of the validity of a tax title.

The law specifies that the amount of all subsequent taxes up to the date of the publication of notice of expiration of redemption and the filing of proof of same in the auditor's office must be published so that the owner may be able to determine the amount required to release the land. In the notice published by Robert Angus in 1890, mention was only made of the delinquent taxes for that year. There was a defect in the published notice which would affect the legality of the defendant's title.

On these grounds the court decided the title to land held by Mrs. Angus is void and of no effect, and she will be obliged to relinquish to the former owner upon payment of all back taxes and penalties by said owner.

Since the 17th comes on Sunday this year, the celebration will be held on Saturday evening, the 16th, at Old Fellow's hall, Little Falls. The indications are that this will be one of the grandest 17th of May celebrations ever held in this city. Eivind Askhus, the greatest living Norwegian violinist, as been engaged for the occasion. 
