

A PLAN FOR IMPROVING LIVE STOCK.

(Furnished by the Minnesota Farmers' Institutes, St. Anthony Park, St. Paul, Minn.)

Plan for Organizing a Community: An excellent plan of organization of community breeders' associations is being put forward by the Michigan College of Agriculture. The plan is to organize the farmers of the community into associations, each association to control 120 cows, one farmer may put in 10 cows, another 20, or any desired number. The association is then divided into blocks, each block containing 40 cows. Three registered bulls are bought of the chosen breed, and one placed with each block of cows. The cost may be prorated among the members according to the number of cows owned. At the end of two years the bulls are rotated, No. 1 going to Block II, No. 2 going to block III, and No. 3 going to block I. Two years later the bulls are rotated again, and two years following that the bulls are replaced by three

new ones. A service fee of \$1.00 for members and \$2.00 for non-member is charged, thus providing funds from which to defray cost of maintenance and handling sires.

Applied to Pure Breeds: While the above plan is applied to a system of grading up native cattle, it can easily be adapted to the problem of a neighborhood breeding of pure bred stock, greatly reducing the cost of pure bred sires and resulting in a center for high class stock. The Division of Animal Husbandry of the College of Agriculture, St. Anthony Park, Minn., will furnish rules and by-laws for such an organization and otherwise assist in establishing such centers in Minnesota.

CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION.

The undersigned hereby associate for the purpose of forming a corporation under the laws of the State of Minnesota, and for that purpose do subscribe and acknowledge the following certificate:

ARTICLE 1.

The name of the corporation shall be Lake Kabetogama Timber and Land Company. The general nature of its business shall be the buying and selling of real estate, of mines and minerals and timber and mineral rights, and it may, upon a vote of three-fourths in interest of its stockholders, engage in logging on any lands owned by it. It shall have all powers necessary and incidental to the transaction of such business, and its principal place of business shall be Little Falls, Minnesota.

ARTICLE 2.

The period of its duration shall be thirty years from the date hereof.

ARTICLE 3.

The names and places of residence of the incorporators are as follows: J. B. Holst, C. F. Holst, F. G. Snow, Barney Burton, H. C. Snow, P. F. Hosch, W. H. K. Moyer, and Hattie E. Germaine of Chicago, Ill.; Florence M. Germaine of Minneapolis, Minn.; M. S. Jacobson of St. Paul, Minn.; and T. W. Clark of St. Cloud, Minn.

ARTICLE 4.

The management of its affairs shall be vested in a Board of Directors composed of three stockholders besides the President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer, who shall be ex-officio members of said board. The date of the annual meeting at which the members of said board shall be elected shall be the first Tuesday in April of each year, and the names and addresses of the persons composing the board until the first election shall be as follows: Dr. J. B. Holst, who shall be President until said meeting; Dr. W. H. K. Moyer, who shall be Vice-President until said meeting; Barney Burton, who shall be Secretary until said meeting, the address of each of whom is Little Falls, Minn.; and T. W. Clark, who shall be Treasurer until said meeting and whose address is St. Cloud, Minn. The other directors until said meeting shall be M. S. Jacobson of St. Paul, Minn.; Florence M. Germaine of Minneapolis, Minn.; and Herbert C. Snow of Little Falls, Minn.

ARTICLE 5.

The amount of capital stock of said corporation shall be \$15,000.00 and shall be paid in by the tracts of land owned by each of the parties near Lake Kabetogama, St. Louis County, Minn., at the rate of \$10.00 an acre. Said capital stock shall be divided into 1500 shares and the par value of each share shall be \$10.00.

ARTICLE 6.

The highest amount of indebtedness or liability to which the corporation shall at any time be subject shall be \$1000.00.

ARTICLE 7.

No stockholder can transfer his stock or any thereof without the consent of a majority of the Board of Directors by vote at a meeting of said board and entered upon the minutes, and any transfer made in contravention of this provision shall be void.
