Richard Croker's Daughter Who is Seeking Divorce.



BIG SUIT AGAINST CROKER

Son-in-Law Alleges Alienation of Wife's Affections.

New York, Dec. 30.—Richard Croker and his sons, Richard Croker, Jr., and Howard Croker, were made joint defendants in a civil action begun by John J. Breen to recover \$100,000. Breen married Miss Ethel J. Croker, daughter of the former Tammany chieftain, on April 28, 1910, and alleged that his wife's affections were alienated by Croker and his sons.

Breen was a teacher of horsemanship when he and Miss Croker were married by a justice of the peace in Hoboken, N. J.

THREE ACCUSED OF DYNAMITING

Further Arrests in Los Angeles Explosion Cases.

Los Angeles, Dec. 31.—Olat A. Tveitmos, secretary treasurer of the State Building Trades council, J. E. Munsey, leader of the Salt Lake union of Structural Iron Workers, and Anton Johansen, organizer of the State Building Trades council, were indicted by the federal grand jury in connection with the alleged national dynamiting conspiracy. Their arrest followed.

The three labor leaders, who have been here for some time as witnesses in the government dynamite investigation, were arrested a few minutes after the indictments were filed in Judge Welborn's court.

None of them expressed any surprise and when told by Deputy United States Marshal Albert Sittell that they were under arrest for alleged complicity with the McNamara brothers and were wanted at once in the federal court they proceeded there without a word.

GERMANS ARE IN THE LEAD

Irish Third in List of Foreign Born Inhabitants.

Washington, Dec. 30.—Numerically the Germans lead all foreign born inhabitants of the United States, according to a census bureau statement. In 1910 the foreign born population of the United States was 13,342,504, of which 3,459,200, or 18.7 per cent were Germans.

Russians and Finland come second, with 1,706,900, or 12.8 per cent, and the Irish come third with 1,351,400, or 10.1 per cent. Italians are next with 1,341,300. Norway, Sweden and Denmark furnish 1,250,500, 9.4 per cent, and Great Britain is represented by 1,214,000, or 9.2 per cent. Canada and Newfoundland contribute 1,198,000, or 9 per cent.

ORLANDO HARRIMAN IS DEAD

Only Brother of Late Famous Financier Succumbs.

New York, Dec. 30.—Orlando Harriman, the only brother of the late E. H. Harriman, died at a private sanitarium in this city from a complication of diseases following a protracted illness.

Mr. Harriman was a widely known real estate operator and was wealthy.

Atwood Meets With Accident.

Lynn, Mass., Jan. 1.—When but a few hundred yards from the Point of Pines at the start of his flight to Portland, Me., Harry N. Atwood met with an accident and fell into the bay water with his hydroplane. He crawled upon the top of his machine and waited for a boat to go to his assistance.
