ADMITS FIRING RESTAURANT

Dawson (Minn.) Man Confesses Setting Blaze Which Caused Death of Two Persons.

Two more deaths are expected as a result of the explosion and fire at Dawson which claimed the lives of Fire Chief Elmer Thompson and Herbert Farnem.

Mrs. A. P. Holton, wife of the restaurant proprietor, who confessed to setting the fire, has been confined to a local hospital suffering from leakage of the catastrophe and of her husband's confession and arrest. It is feared the shock will kill her.

Martin E. Jacobson, who was injured at the fire, took a turn for the worse and physicians have given up hope of saving his life. He is a brother-in-law of Holton.

Holton is confined in the county jail at Madison awaiting a preliminary hearing, the date for which has not been set. He has obtained W. Ewing, a Madison attorney, as counsel.

Holton's confession, according to officials, does not say where he procured the nitroglycerin which caused the explosion, and an effort is being made to trace its sale.

SEES NO NEED OF MILITIA

Adjutant General of Minnesota Discusses Mexican Situation.

Adjutant General Fred B. Wood of the Minnesota national guard says he has received no word of any kind from Washington in regard to the Mexican situation and said that he does not believe it will ever be necessary for the federal government to call on the organized militia to assist in subduing the southern republic.

"The Minnesota militia," he said, "is fully equipped and ready to get under way in a few hours in the case of necessity. We do not, however, anticipate any call to arms and would be much surprised should it come. I think the navy and the regular army can take care of any trouble that may arise in Mexico for some time to come, but, of course, there is always the danger of a protracted struggle and in such an event the militia might be needed."

HASTY EXITS TO SAVE LIVES

Fire Damages Last of Mill City's Numerous Sawmills.

Four hundred employees were forced to make a hasty exit through every hole affording egress when fire broke out and threatened to destroy the North Star Lumber company's mill the last remaining of the once numerous Minneapolis sawmills.

Eighty men saved their lives by jumping from the windows of the second floor to the ground.

Andrew Smith, working on a gang saw, was severely burned. Superintendent D. J. Flannigan risked his life trying to stop the flames with the emergency hose, but got out of the building safely. The fire started from an overheated bearing.

TWO FALL FROM BRIDGES

Minneapolis Men Meet Death in Similar Manner.

Two men drowned after falls from bridges spanning the Mississippi was Minneapolis' record for one day.

Less than twelve hours after John Gregory fell from the Great Northern railroad bridge and was drowned the police received word of the similar death of an unidentified man who fell from the Plymouth avenue bridge.

The man, who was about forty-five years old, appeared to be a workman homeward bound.

PIONEER ARCHITECT DEAD

Augustin F. Knight Settled in St. Paul in 1856.

Augustin F. Knight, dean of Minnesota architects and one of the oldest members of his profession in the country, died suddenly while reading in his room at the Lambert hotel in St. Paul. He was eight-three years of age.

He fought in the Civil and Indian wars. He came to St. Paul in 1856 and since has been a prominent figure.

Boy of Sixteen Ends Life.

A reprimand from his parents for staying out late nights is believed to have prompted Edward Kliez of St. Paul, sixteen years of age, to end his life by hanging himself to a bedpost with a necktie. Members of the family told Coroner Jones that the boy also had been despondent for three days.

St. Paul Pioneer Dead.

Captain James King, one of St. Paul's earliest settlers, is dead in that city. Captain King had been prominent in the city's business and official life during his active years. He had been ill for some time and because of his advanced years had not been expected to recover.


