MONTHLY MORBIDITY REPORT

County Auditor B. Y. McNairy is in receipt of the monthly morbidity report from the state board of health for the month of July. The report shows that there were but four cases of contagious disease in the county during the month. Three cases of diphtheria were reported at Bowls village and one case of tuberculosis at Motley village. In connection with the report is a letter urging the people to fight the dreaded disease, typhoid fever, which is prevalent at this time, especially among harvest workers. The laboratories of the Division of Preventable Diseases of the state board of health offers typhoid vaccine free of charge to all physicians in this state. Although the reports for August are not yet complete the board estimates that the number of typhoid cases through the state during that month this year will be more than 200, as compared with 165 cases last year.

WANT SPECIAL TRAIN FOR STEARNS COUNTY FAIR

It is possible that a special train may run from this city to Sauk Centre on September 16 for the Stearns county fair. The managers of the Stearns county fair have written the local Elks lodge, asking them to try to induce enough people to go to make it worth while to run a special. The local Elks baseball team is scheduled to play St. Cloud at the fair at Sauk Centre on that day and it was thought that a large number of people would make the trip if a special could be secured for a nominal sum. The managers state that if a good crowd can be secured from this city they will take up the matter with other towns along the L. F. & D. branch line and with the Northern Pacific.

RUSSIAN VICTORY IN GALICIA REPORTED

London, Sept. 2.—A dispatch to the Daily News from Rome declares news has been received there from Bucharest, Roumania, setting forth that the Russians have inflicted a crushing defeat on the Austrians in Galicia. The Russians inflicted a loss of 20,000 on the enemy, who sought to cross the Vistula. It is evident that fierce fighting is proceeding in the neighborhood of Lublin. According to the Russko Slovo the losses suffered by the Austrians in their desperate attempt to strike at the vitals of the Russian position in Poland aggregate tens of thousands of men, including the Sixth Austrian corps, which, on its retreat between the Western Bug and the Wieprez rivers, was almost annihilated.

TURKEY TO GET INTO MIXUP

Declaration of War Looked for in Near Future. Washington, Sept. 2.—The British embassy has been informed by a cable from London that German officers have gone to Constantinople to take charge of the Turkish army and that a declaration of war from Turkey is expected. Plans are under way to ask the American ambassador at Constantinople to take charge of the British interests there. The Turkish ambassador, A. Rustem Bey, expressed doubt that the Turkish army was mobilizing and about to fight on the side of Germany. He said the Turkish army was mobilized three weeks ago.

FRENCH RESERVISTS CALLED

Paris, Sept. 2.—The minister of war has decided to call out immediately all the reservists in the country who have not been previously summoned to the colors.

The news that the emperor has left the western headquarters and moved to the Russian front has shown the residents of the capital where the immediate peril of their safety lies. "A story has been circulated that the Russians are preparing to avenge Louvain by treating the city of Berlin in the same way as the Germans treated that city. Many of the populace who can get away are going to Norway, Denmark and Switzerland."

RUSSIAN VICTORY IN GALICIA REPORTED

London, Sept. 2.—A dispatch to the Daily News from Rome declares news has been received there from Bucharest, Roumania, setting forth that the Russians have inflicted a crushing defeat on the Austrians in Galicia. The Russians inflicted a loss of 20,000 on the enemy, who sought to cross the Vistula. It is evident that fierce fighting is proceeding in the neighborhood of Lublin. According to the Russko Slovo the losses suffered by the Austrians in their desperate attempt to strike at the vitals of the Russian position in Poland aggregate tens of thousands of men, including the Sixth Austrian corps, which, on its retreat between the Western Bug and the Wieprez rivers, was almost annihilated.

TURKEY TO GET INTO MIXUP

Declaration of War Looked for in Near Future. Washington, Sept. 2.—The British embassy has been informed by a cable from London that German officers have gone to Constantinople to take charge of the Turkish army and that a declaration of war from Turkey is expected. Plans are under way to ask the American ambassador at Constantinople to take charge of the British interests there. The Turkish ambassador, A. Rustem Bey, expressed doubt that the Turkish army was mobilizing and about to fight on the side of Germany. He said the Turkish army was mobilized three weeks ago.

FRENCH RESERVISTS CALLED

Paris, Sept. 2.—The minister of war has decided to call out immediately all the reservists in the country who have not been previously summoned to the colors.
