### HUGHES REPUBLICAN NOMINEE

#### JUSTICE UNANIMOUSLY CHOSEN BY CONVENTION—BULL MOOSE NOMINATES ROOSEVELT

Charles E. Hughes was on Saturday unanimously nominated the republican candidate for president by the republicans at the convention at Chicago. The actual vote was 949 1/2 votes out of a possible 987 for Hughes, but it was made unanimous. Roosevelt, the closest competitor to Hughes, got 18 1/2 votes. Minnesota went unanimous for Hughes after the second ballot.

As yet Mr. Hughes has made no statement, except to say that his attitude is one of undiluted Americanism and that anybody who supports him is supporting an out-and-out American and absolutely nothing else, this statement being in answer to inquiries as to his attitude in regard to the support offered him by the German-Americans.

At the same time Saturday that Hughes was nominated by the republicans the progressives, also in convention at Chicago, nominated Teddy Roosevelt as their candidate for the presidency. He was elected by acclamation.

Roosevelt has declined to accept the nomination of the progressives, saying that he is out of politics and will not head a third ticket.

For candidate for vice president the republicans chose Charles Warren Fairbanks of Indianapolis, who was elected vice president with Teddy Roosevelt in 1904. The progressives nominated John M. Parker of Louisiana.






