

JOY RIDE HAS SAD ENDING

One Gets Broken Nose and Leg, But Not from Car Accident—Others Fined.

A broken nose and a broken leg for one and fines for two others were the result of a mixup that took place in the south part of the city last Friday afternoon.

Mike Mush of Wadena, and Romeo Crappeau of Minneapolis, stated at the suggestion of George Childers of Wadena, owner of the car, they started from that place for a joy ride, which continued to Little Falls.

After celebrating more or less here they were joined by George Harris of this city. Childers and Harris wished to go to Minneapolis, but the other two wanted to return to Wadena.

The car got away from down town with all but Mush on board headed for Minneapolis, but Mush jumping on the running board of a passing car, going down Second street soon overtook them, at Fifth avenue southeast, and it is said struck Childers back of the head, his head striking the steering wheel and breaking his nose. Later a wheel was thrown but hit no one. Harris also got a beautiful bump in the mixup.

A hurry call was sent in and Sheriff Ehn after some search put Mush and Crappeau, who made for the river, under arrest.

The car was placed at the Motor Inn by the sheriff with instructions to let no one have it. Childers later put in an appearance, and in an argument over the car, it is stated Childers drew a knife. A passage at arms took place between Mark Buckman and Childers and when the smoke had cleared away Childers had sustained a broken leg and was taken to the hospital, but has since been able to leave it.

In municipal court Saturday morning Mush and Crappeau each were fined \$5 each, amounting to \$11.75 in each case.
