22. J. K. Martin, food administrator, denies food hoarding rumor and offers reward for the evidence to convict. Affidavit later made by one giving out was unfounded.

23. Forty men who had become 21 years of age since June 5, registered with the local draft board.

24. Nine men left for Camp Wadsworth.

25. Fourteen men left for Camp Grant.

26. One man left for Camp Wadsworth.

27. Franceska Zarad gave concert at M. E. church for blind soldiers.

28. Word received Corp. Arthur Brousseau wounded in shoulder; also received he had been previously wounded.

29. Three men left for Camp Dodge.

September

4. Six men leave for Camp Grant.

5. Announcement that former Congressman Lindberg is in employ of the War Relocation Authority. His position resulted and Mr. Lindberg's appointment was withdrawn.

6. Seventy-five men leave for Camp Grant.

7. Casualties name W. H. Patten of Fort Ripley as being killed in action in France.

8. From 18 to 45 of the county registered to the number of 2589.

9. Train load of war trophies in the Little Falls in connection with the Fourth Liberty Loan drive.

10. Gov. Burnquist and A. D. Wilson make addresses at county fair on Patriotic day.

11. Legal advisory board arrange to assist with the questionnaires every week day.

12. Announcement that Arthur Johnson of this city died from wounds received in action July 23; also death of Petrus Liljedahl, killed August 23; casualties also carry the name of Albert Dolvin of Swanville, as having died of wounds.

13. Junior Red Cross of public schools make campaign for collection of nut shells and fruit pits to make gas masks.

14. Morrison county goes "over the top" in the fourth Liberty Loan the first day, and is third county of district to report.

October

3. Local draft board given clear record and commended after investigation by Capt. John F. Smith.

4. Daily prayer for men on battle front was inaugurated.

5. Word received that Lenus Larson of Randall had died of disease overseas.

6. Sophus Madson of Elm Dale died of a Georgia training camp of influenza.

7. Harry E. Everding of Freehem died at Jefferson Barracks, Missouri, of pneumonia.

8. John Kugel arrested for threatening draft board. Was bound over to grand jury.

9. Kurtz of Pierz died of pneumonia at Camp Custer, Mich., a few days previous.

10. Musical Art club opens season by celebrating Liberty day.

11. Gasless Sunday declared off.

12. Oscar Benson of Upsala died of influenza at Knoxville, Tenn.

13. Twenty-two men left for Camp Cody, New Mexico.

14. Sixty-seven men left for Camp Forrest, Ga.

15. G. H. Blanchett received word that his son Lawrence had died in France from pneumonia.

16. Maurice Larson seriously wounded in France.

17. Death of Herman Strochein of Swanville at Camp Cody, N. M., of influenza.

November

3. Telegrams to relatives tell of the death in action of Lee Shuffelt on Sept. 28 and Lloyd Magee on Oct. 1.

4. Beatrice Draxton died in England of pneumonia.

5. Report that the armistice had been signed, which later proved to be erroneous. Big celebration was held.

6. Letter dated October 4, tells of the wounding in the arm of Wm. Taylor in action in France.

7. Dated Oct. 8, tells of injury to Frank Dey in England, he being struck in the leg by propeller of an aeroplane. Alvin B. Nelson of Elm Dale recovering from wounds in shoulder in France on Oct. 22.

8. Mention of citation of Private Michael Tandeeck, dated Aug. 11 for distinguished conduct in the battle of the Marne on Sept. 22.

9. Armistice was signed. This was the real thing and Little Falls again had a grand celebration that day and night.

10. Beginning of War Work Campaign. Mainly because of the signing of the armistice and influenza the drive was not as successful as it would have been.

11. Draft calls were called off and men gathered at draft rooms ready to go for Ft. Riley, Kansas, did not enter.

12. Chairman Millard reports that there were 25 star winners in the Fourth Liberty Loan drive.

13. Reported that Ernest H. Johnson had been killed in action in France.

14. Otto Huffman of Lastrup was bound over to the federal court at Duluth on a charge of obstructing Liberty Loan Bond sale.

15. This issue notes the wounding in service of Frank Koning of Cassin. Otto Plett who suffered a broken arm and a wound in the shoulder Sept. 26, wounding of Arthur Brousseau for a third time, Joseph Rudeck of Pike Creek, rifle bullet through left arm and slightly wounding of John C. Olson of Little Falls.

16. Draft board ordered to complete all 19 to 36 classifications and classify all 18 year old registrants for statistical purposes.

17. This issue tells of citation for extraordinary heroism of Corporal Julius Nelson on Oct. 4.

18. Mr. and Mrs. Oscar Winberg of Randall receives notice of death of their son, Swen from wounds received in action.

19. Word received of death of John Tomala of Pierz while in action in France at the battle of Verdun, ally of man and of Eiskiel Edouard of Randall as having been killed in France.

20. Casualties bear the name of Bernard Brown as having died of disease overseas.

December

1. Word received from William Kleiberg who was reported missing in France November 1st, stating that he was still alive and well.

2. K. C. announces 62 out of 250 members in the service.

3. Morrison County War records committee appointed.

4. Casualty list bears name of Carl Bousberg, Darling, wounded in leg; Frank Czech of Two Rivers severely wounded; E. O. Larson of Swanville, wounded; Philip Rudeck of Ft. Snelling, wounded; Matt Elsel of Fort Ripley, as dying from accident; Sgt. Harry Swanson, killed Sept. 29; Albert S. Amyshefsky missing Aug. 29.

5. Little Falls Black Granite Co. offers city memorial monument.

6. O. C. Larson received telegrams telling of the death of his son, Private David H. Larson, in action Nov. 31, and of Lewis Larson as being severely wounded on October 30.

7. Nell Rasmussen of Route 8 was severely wounded Nov. 6. Word was also received that Albert Fedorapell of Warroad was wounded; Jos. Mazzaria of Jean River severely wounded November 11; Oscar Samuelson, severely wounded on Oct. 11; Elmer Skinner, wounded Oct. 5; Elmer Johnson wounded; John E. Farnet of Pierz, slightly wounded; George Merkling of Pierz severely wounded; Homer Gendreau of Pierz severely wounded.

8. Richard Meyers, injured in France June 15, was the first wounded

man to return home from overseas. He suffered a relapse and was sent to Rochester, but is doing nicely.

9. Otto Plett, wounded in France and stationed at Fort Snelling hospital, was the second boy from overseas to come home.

10. Fred Nelson is reported to have died of pneumonia in France.

11. Published list shows over \$1500 raised for the stricken Poles of the old country.

12. War records committee holds first meeting.

13. Records of Draft Board sealed.

14. William Taylor wounded in France, Sept. 30, arrived home on a furlough.

15. Mrs. Gourd of Randall receives word of the death of her son Charles, who died of wounds in September.

16. Halile Weston, son of N. F. Weston, died of influenza at Ft. Oglethorpe, Ga.

17. John Olson of Pike Creek receives a letter from his son, John E. Olson, dated November 28, stating that he is well. He had been reported killed on Oct. 23.

18. Casualty list contained the names of Stanley Christenson, slightly wounded; George E. Lucek of Flensburg, who was reported missing; Nels Larson, Swanville, severely wounded.

19. Prof. Maria Sanford speaks on Americanization before Musical Art club. The program following Mrs. Sanford gives patriotic address at Union Services.

20. Red Cross membership drive in the city reaches 1122.

21. Waste reclamation council organized.
