selves. The board has the matter un-
der consideration and is expected to
take favorable action.

Film Story of Club Work Now Being Told

The story of the purpose, organiza-
tion and results of boys' and girls'
club work is being flashed on the
screen in various Minnesota towns.
Five copies of the film, which was
made under the auspices of the agri-
cultural extension service of the state
university at the Union Stock Yards
company of South St. Paul, have been
prepared, and there is prospect that
hundreds of bookings for the picture
will be made over the state.
The film is entitled "Partners,"
meaning the partnership which is gen-
erally developed by club work between
the juniors and their fathers. The
scenes portray the life story of boys'
and girls' livestock clubs, the work of
the county farm bureau and its agents,
county fair and county fairs, and other
activities, including the awards of prizes,
auction, banquet, etc.

railroad union men, headed by Wil-
liam H. Johnston, president of the In-
ternational Association of Machinists.
Declared by Morris Hillquit of New
York to be "the most significant event
that has taken place in the American
labor movement for a generation," the
conference brought together leaders
high in labor and minor political party
circles.

announced that he had resigned from
the bench and would devote his
entire time to his position of baseball
commissioner.
The resignation is effective March 1.
Announcement of it was made form-
ally by the judge as he took his place
in court.

day for all of my activities," said the
judge. "Therefore, I have forwarded my
resignation as federal judge to
Washington, effective March 1."
