MUST SURRENDER.

Bombardment of Manila Will Force Spanish to Surrender.

WASHINGTON, May 2, 1:10 p. m. Commodore Dewey's instructions permit him to bombard Manila if it is necessary in order to take possession of the islands, but he will not do so unless the city harbors troops operating offensively against him. President McKinley will soon issue a proclamation in restraint of Spanish subjects in the United States.

LONDON, May 2.—The British governor of the strait's settlements has cabled that the American fleet has annihilated the Spanish fleet near Manila harbor, in a two hours' engagement. Commodore Dewey has demanded the surrender of all torpedoes and guns at Manila and the control of the cable under pain of bombardment of the city by his fleet. The Spanish General Augusta refused and the bombardment of the city is now supposed to be in progress.

CONFIRMED.

Late Advices This P. M. Confirm Reported Victory at Manila.

WASHINGTON, May 2, 2:50 p. m.—Advices just received from London state that the British consul at Manila has advised the foreign office that the Spanish fleet in the Philippines was practically annihilated. Dispatches from Paris state that advices from Madrid received in Paris say no Spanish warship surrendered and that the majority perished. The Spanish admit a heavy loss of life the killed being estimated at 400.

THE VICTORY OURS.

The U. S. Fleet at Manila Sweeps Everything Before It.

Commodore Dewey Wins the Greatest Naval Battle Seen for Years.

Spanish Fleet Destroyed and Many Spaniards Killed and Wounded.

MADRID, May 1, 11:10.—Further advices from Manila to the Liberals state that the United States fleet has taken up a position in front of Manila and has established a blockade of the port. The population of the city is fleeing in fear of bombardment of the town which is expected today. It is now admitted in Madrid on all sides that the Spanish fleet has been completely destroyed. The organ of the Spanish premier admits complete defeat. A dispatch to the London Daily Mail this morning says the Americans are now moving on Manila, but no capitulation has yet been made. General Augusti, commandant at Manila, will probably defend the plaza of the city. The Spanish minister admits that the naval battle ended in the utter rout of the Spanish fleet but all are resolved not to spare any efforts in defense of the country. The Spanish warships *Renia Maria Christina* and *Castilla* were totally burned. One vessel was purposely sunk and the rest damaged. The American fleet is believed to be much damaged. The authorities at Madrid have adopted most extreme military precautions to check increasing public indignation at the disaster to Spanish fleet. Martial law is likely to be proclaimed.

SALARIES FIXED.

Board of Education Met Monday and Adopted a Scale of Teachers' Wages.

The board of education met in adjourned session at the Central building today. All members were present.

Upon motion duly seconded and carried the following scale of wages for teachers for the ensuing year was adopted, the first year teachers being the lowest:

First primary grade first year \$45
First primary grade second year \$50
Second to fifth grades, first year \$40, second year \$45.
Sixth and Seventh grades, first year \$45, second year \$50.
Eighth grade, first year \$50, second year \$55.

Upon motion duly carried in the matter of the salary of the principal of the high school it was left at the option of the board to place it at from \$65 to \$75 per month, and for first and second assistants at \$55 for first year and \$60 for second year.

It was moved and carried that all the present teachers who wished to remain for the ensuing term be hired subject to the above scale of wages.

On motion carried the salary of the principal of the high school was fixed at \$70 per month for the next year.

Owing to the pressure of other business some of the members of the board did not have time today to consider the work of electing the teachers for the ensuing year, and it was postponed until the regular meeting of the board next Wednesday afternoon.

It is understood that all but four of the present list of teachers have made application for next year.

The four who have not applied are Miss Walker, first assistant of the high school, who it is said will go to Moorhead, and Misses Buchanan, Gram and Kate Meyers, of the grades.

Applications for the vacancies will be considered at the Wednesday meeting.

MILLIONS FOR WAR.

The House Passed the Emergency bill Appropriating \$35,000,000.

WASHINGTON, May 2, 2:03 p. m.—The war emergency bill, appropriating over \$35,000,000 passed the house without division. Cable communications with Manila are interrupted. A Hongkong bulletin says the bombardment is in progress.




