FOREIGN NEWS.

PORTLAND, Feb. 10. The steamer Jura, which left Liverpool Thursday 30th, and London Friday 31st, arrived at 11:45 to-night. Mason and Shedd had arrived at Southampton. No demonstrations were made. The former went to London, the latter to Paris.

London opened the French Chamber on the 25th. He said the civil war which desolates America has greatly compromised our commercial interests. So long however, as the rights of neutrals are respected, we must confine ourselves to expressing wishes for an early termination of these dissensions.

France recommended to Rome to conciliate the Court of Turin—Antonelli absolutely refused all terms.

The following is the text of the report: Earl Russell, in a dispatch dated January 23d, to Lord Lyons, says the English Government differs entirely from Mr. Seward's conclusions on the question whether the persons taken from the Trent, and their supposed dispatches, were contraband.
