DR. McCALL'S LECTURES ON ANATOMY AND PHYSIOLOGY.—The last of the course will be given this evening. Subject, "The Skin and Hair." Programme for the Fourth. The Committee have agreed upon the following programme for the celebration of the coming Fourth of July.

At sunrise a national salute of 24 guns.—This same at noon and at sunset. At 10 o'clock A. M., a procession will form on Plum Street right resting on Main Street, in the following order:

Band of Music; Fire Department; President and Vice Presidents; Orator of the day; Reader of the Declaration of Independence; Chaplain; Committee of arrangements; 31 young ladies representing all the States; citizens on foot and in carriages, followed by Hopkin's Battery, the procession will move up Main to Broad Street—up Broad to Third Street—up Third to Pine Street—up Pine to Fourth Street—down Fourth to Dakota Street—up Dakota to Fifth Street—down Fifth Street to West Avenue—up West Avenue to Grove.

The following order of exercises will be observed: Prayer by the Chaplain; music by the Band; Reading of the Declaration of Independence; singing by the Choir; Oration; Red White and Blue song by 34 young ladies. The procession will then return to Main Street in like order. There will be a grand military display by the Guerrillas in the afternoon, and a grand trial of the New Engine. In the evening there will be a grand torch light procession.

TRIAL OF REAPERS. Last Thursday a grand trial of Reapers, or perhaps more properly mowers, (for they were used as mowers) took place near this City. The Mowers engaged were the Champion, G. C. Johnson agent, Badger State C. H. & E. L. Baker agents, Manny, Mr. Marvin agent, Buck Eye Mesrolo & McLaren agent, and the Kirby Brown & Betcher agents. The place selected was a field of red clover about half a mile from town. The clover was rank, thick and wet and badly lodged. Every one who saw it admitted that if a machine would work well there it would work anywhere. Five judges were appointed, who measured off the ground assigned to each, and at it they went. It is so noted that the Champion and the Kirby worked better than the rest and many contended the Champion came out of the contest far ahead. All we can say is, they both worked well, and we are not competent to say which worked best. The Buck Eye worked well the only fault being that it clogged badly in the wet clover.

The Badger State can scarcely be said to have had a fair trial, as it broke just as it started, and had to be withdrawn. The agent says it was a defective casting that broke, and was not occasioned by an inherent weakness in the machine.

It is announced that in pursuance of a Joint resolution of Congress, and an order from the War Department, dated June 21st, 1892, and entitled "an order to encourage enlistment," a premium of two dollars will be paid by the United States, for each accepted recruit who volunteers for three years or during the war, and that every soldier who hereafter enlists, either in the regular army or in the volunteer forces, for three years or during the war, may receive his first month's pay in advance upon mustering of his company into the service of the United States, or after he shall have been mustered into and joined a regiment already in the service.
