MURDER AND SUICIDE.

George Lamouriux, Mixed Blood Indian, Kills Mrs. Caroline Holstein, Then Sends Bullet Through Own Brain.

The residents of this village were shocked last Thursday night when it was reported that Mrs. Caroline Holstein had been shot and killed at the home of her father in the north part of the village by George Lamouriux, who then ended his own life by shooting himself in the head.

It is four years since THE TOMA-HAWK has had to chronicle such a fearful tragedy as that enacted at the Beaupre home last Thursday night.

Four years ago Peter King played the roll of murderer and suicide when he shot and instantly killed Maude Sweet and then took his own life.

The facts in Thursday night's tragedy as near as can be learned dead woman's little brother James, who is bed ridden as the result of an auto accident three years ago, are as follows:

George Tamouriux came to this reservation some time last spring and had been employed at odd jobs around town, lately being employed by Peter Martin in the capacity of stage driver between this place and Ogema. He became acquaint ed with Mrs. Holstein, who was divorced from her husband some time ago, and had been keeping company with her for the past six months, he was extremely jealous and had threatened her several times. He had supper at her home on Thursday evening and about 8 o'clock he and Mrs. Holstein were standing near the stove engaged in conversation when she turned and started to walk away across the room, Lamouriux then pulled a revolver and shot her through the head, the bullet entered behind the right ear and came out through the right cheek, he then placed the weapon to his forehead and sent a bullet through his brain. Both died instantly.

Coroner Nunn of Detroit was notified by telephone and arrived early Friday morning, and after lion dollar payment from the aciewing the remains gave a verdict of murder and suicide.

Mrs. Caroline Holstein was the daughter of Paul and Nancy She was married eleven years ago to Benjamen Holstein, from whom she was recently divorced. Four children resulted from this union, namely; Emma May, Mar-8, 11, 7 and 4 years respectfully. All four children were asleep up the tragedy occurred.

Lamouriux, who is a mixedto obtain a divorce.

That he had contemplated his dastardly act is evident from the following letter found in his pocket after the crime:

"White Earth, Minn. Dec. 11th, 1916. Dear friends and relatives:

Do not blame me for what has happened to us, for Caroline Holstein is the cause of this, what happened to us she is to blame, now our troubles are over."

On the reverse side of the sheet and a HAPPY NEW YEAR. of letter paper was writ:en -"Geo. Tamouriux that is my name, notify E. J. Farlow, Lander, Wyoming.

As the letter was written on Monday he evidently planned to carry out the crime at that time but did not have the opportunity.

Besides the four small children the unfortunate woman leaves a father and several brothers and sisters to mourn her loss.


