After holding minor local offices in his home village of Tahlequah, and serving as its first mayor when it was made a city of the first class in 1908, Teehee was sent to the Oklahoma Legislature, served later as county attorney, went to the legislature again in 1912, and specialized in constitutional law. In 1914 he was appointed United States Probate Attorney under the Interior Department, which office he filled until he resigned to take the oath as Register of the Treasury, March 24th, 1915.

And that is how the name of Houston B. Teehee, a Cherokee Indian, once a ward of the Government, happens to be affixed to the Liberty bonds of the world war, in twenty million American homes.—by George Martin, in the American Magazine.

Hon. Houston B. Teehee is to be congratulated not only because as a native American he has been found worthy and well qualified to execute the duties of the high position to which he has been appointed but to the further fact that he was not a resident of this agency in which case, it is probable that he might not have escaped the scurrilous imputation of "incompetent Injun" by the agency "incompetent" board.

Mrs. Allen Beaupre was a Detroit visitor last Friday.

Martin Davis, of Detroit, was buying up fur here during the week.

Miss Neta Martin, who has been attending school at Minneapolis, arrived home the first of the week to spend the holidays.

San Smith is reported filling the "farmer's" position at the boarding school and occupying the place of Mr. Cross who has been transferred to Pine Ridge agency.

Sergt. P. G. Henderson arrived home last Saturday. Mr. Henderson, who has been stationed at Camp Taylor, Kentucky, is now released from service and will again assume his duties as agency blacksmith.

The pupils of Miss Ethel Meredith and Miss Hazel Mitchell's school, school district No. 112, of this village, rendered a very commendable and interesting program, consisting of recitations, dialogues and songs, on Tuesday afternoon. After the program was closed the pupils were presented with gifts from a well laden Christmas tree provided by their teachers. Both Miss Meredith and Miss Mitchell are to be congratulated at the manifest success and progress of their pupils. And notwithstanding that the schools were closed about one month on account of the prevalence of influenza the progress of the pupils generally was not materially impeded.

Harry D. Powell, who has had charge of the Beaulieu government day school for the past two years, died at the agency hospital last Thursday of stomach trouble. Mr. Powell was formerly in charge of the government day school at Round Lake. From what we know of the deceased he was a man who endeavored to do his duty and when occasion offered itself he never hesitated to defend the Indian's side of the question, fearlessly and without favor. A few years ago while in attendance at an "Indian Teacher's Convention," held at the school assembly hall, a fickle minded female teacher, asserted that "after due consideration" she had come to the conclusion that the "Indian boys and

girls were morally depraved," etc. To which Mr. Powell retorted in a most vehement contradictory assertion and administered a very merited rebuke to the uncalled for insult.

A bow e geshig, who once swore that he was a mixed blood for the purpose of selling his land, and afterwards swore again that he was and is a full-blood to get his land back, and who is the most potent example of the unprogressive warehouse type of Indian on this reservation, a leader among that class of his ilk who are now howling to strike the mixed bloods from the rolls of the Chippewas, and who has always been lovingly fondled by the superintendent here and the Indian bureau, paid Mr. Hinton a pleasant call the past week, and returned to his home at Pine Point laden with a generous supply of government pork and flour hauled thither with a government team, and it may be added that the team, harness, sled, pork, flour, likewise the driver's wages are all derived from appropriations of Chippewa tribal funds and fully 90 per cent of the members of the said Chippewas receive absolutely no benefit from the proceeds of such appropriations.
