Johnston and will be remembered by the people of this village. His father, the Rev. J. Johnston, was for a number of years missionary in charge of the St. Columba Episcopal Mission at this place. There are two other brothers in the service, Samuel and Corporal Fred Johnston, the latter was wounded at about the same time his brother was killed, and is now in a hospital somewhere in France.
