In commemoration of the critical condition into which the State was thrown in consequence of the Sioux outbreak of August, 1862, and in just appreciation of important services rendered by the stubborn defenders of New Ulm against the repeated attacks of the hostiles, the state of Minnesota has caused the erection of a monument at New Ulm to perpetuate the memory of the battles at this place, and as the monument will be turned over to the city by the proper authorities on the 29th anniversary of the historic events, Saturday, August 22, 1891, the citizens of New Ulm hereby extend a cordial invitation to the heroic defenders to honor this city with their presence on that occasion.

The men of those dark days are fast passing away, and as this will probably be the last occasion for a general reunion of those who stood ready to sacrifice their lives in repelling the attacks of the Indians, we confidently expect that every one of the old defenders will participate, and nothing will be wanting on our part to make the visit a pleasant and memorable one for them and their families.

Arrangements will be made for excursion trains, so that all the participants can reach our city by 10 o'clock on Saturday, August 22nd.
