NEWS FROM WASHINGTON.

An interesting letter from our regular correspondent at the Capital.

The case of Foreman Miller was brought up before the American Federation of Labor at its annual convention at Boston...

According to the terms of the Hay-Bunau-Varilla treaty just signed by our secretary of state and the Panama minister, the United States is granted absolute sovereignty over a strip of land five miles wide on each side of the canal...

A few hours after the treaty was signed the Panama commissioners arrived in Washington. They expressed satisfaction with the terms of the document and one of them will take it to Panama for ratification.

General Reyes, the Colombian peace commissioner, says he is coming to Washington to arrange affairs amicably, and that unless a satisfactory agreement is made Colombia will fight and we shall have a war on our hands.

Another interesting letter. A few days ago we received the following letter from Washington, which is of special interest to those who know Mr. Brunner and the others mentioned therein:

Perhaps my intrusion may be a surprise to you, and possibly not an agreeable one, but whatsoever may be, here goes, hit or miss, sink or swim, live or die: we take the chance; we can but perish if we try.

He is a fine-looking officer, and to me is the same kind, genial, pleasant boy as of old, notwithstanding the fact that he wears a mustache, shoulder straps with two bars and a name among the most honored of our country.

He was pretty badly worn out by continued long field service in the Philippines, and with his father, Col. Pershing, who is quite broken in body and spirit since the death of Mrs. Pershing, spent some time at healing springs in southern Indiana.
