

Mrs. Petty resided alone in an elegant residence on High street and during the storm which passed over this city at that hour she became startled at the running of the motor in the basement and went to the home of Mr. Childress and

called him to come to her assistance. Mr. and Mrs. Childress accompanied her to her basement and when Mrs. Petty attempted to turn on the electric light she uttered an exclamation of pain and fell dead. City Electrician Western and Dr. Home were called and both responded but life was extinct. It is generally believed that the excitement produced heart failure.
