Hooverized Prices

The latest instructions from the State Food Administrator to the Jobbers and Retailers of the state are as follows:

Retailers ARE REQUIRED to sell licensed food commodities at reasonable prices, based upon pre-war profits and WITHOUT REGARD TO COST of replacement of goods or to speculative profits.

Flour should be sold in quantities not exceeding one bag—one fourth barrel—to a family. Retailers' profits on flour SHOULD NOT EXCEED \$1.00 PER BARREL. It MUST NOT exceed \$1.25 per barrel.

Sugar should be sold in quantities NOT EXCEEDING 5 POUNDS to a family. It MUST NOT be sold in quantities exceeding ten pounds to a family. It is being sold in various parts of the state at from 8 1-2 to 9 1-2 cents per pound. **Ten cents per pound is the limit**

Jobbers who have goods in their warehouses which had been bought at low prices are now forced to sell them at the price which was paid for them plus a reasonable profit. Since this licensed ruling has gone into effect we have been able to pick up several food commodities at prices that prevailed a year or so ago and as long as we have them for sale at the following prices:


