Linn and Neighboring County News Briefly Recorded

Brookfield will have an Uncle Tom show next Tuesday night.

The state encampment of the Grand Army of the Republic will be held at Trenton on Wednesday and Thursday of next week.

Mr. James Clay Elliott of Jacksonville, Ill., and Miss Dorothy Sherman will be united in marriage at the Grace Episcopal church in Chillicothe next Saturday morning. The groom is a son of Mr. and Mrs. J. A. Elliott, former well known citizens of Laclede, the young man being born here. The family's many old friends here extend best wishes to Clay and his bride in advance.

It has been suggested by New York democratic women leaders that the women delegates to the San Francisco convention go dressed in gingham and calico. This is doubtless intended to suggest that these once humble materials, after seven years of democratic reduction of the high cost of living, are as high in price as silk and satin used to be in the good old republican days.

The present session of congress will wind up its work next month with the unprecedented record of having reduced the estimate of the various branches of the government for appropriations by nearly \$1,500,000,000, republican leaders predict. The saving to the taxpayers of the country virtually equals the total expenditures of the federal government in any year before the war.

The republican women over at Marceline have formed a live organization. At a largely attended meeting an extensive committee, composed of one lady for each street, was appointed to make a complete poll of women voters in Marceline and the township. The poll is to be completed this week and another meeting held to consider it and form a complete township organization. This plan should be followed in every township in the county.

In a summary of the work of the automobile registration department for the month of April the secretary of state estimates there are 13,000 unregistered cars in seventy-eight counties of the state, exclusive of new cars sold since January 1. Sheriffs and prosecuting attorneys of these counties have been requested to aid in the prosecution of owners of unlicensed motor vehicles. The records show that up to May 1, there have been registered and licensed 283,132 automobiles, 2,343 dealers, 2,644 motorcycles and 19,192 chauffeurs.

John I. Purdin, president of the Stockgrowers Bank at Purdin and one of the county's most widely known citizens, met death at his home in Purdin last week from taking a dose of arsenic by mistake. After eating dinner he went to the medicine case to take some magnesia and instead got arsenic and took a large dose before discovering the mistake. He had bought the poison to kill moles in the yard. Physicians were summoned but they were unable to save him. He was past 70 years of age and had recently returned from spending the winter in California.
