Poor Old Marshall

I believe that there is in this country today a great spiritual awakening, and the church is beginning to see that it has turned over entirely too many of its functions to the state.

Marshall didn't exactly say that parochial schools were good things and that they should be supported by the state, but that's what he meant, and on several occasions he has made it plainer than he happened to do in this particular case.

Marshall has made no announcement to the effect that he has become a convert to Romanism, but it is expected that he will go the Lorimer route sooner or later and give Rome's saint million other job.

Rome at Home

The following are a few extracts taken from a published article of Dr. D. G. Whittinghill, president of the Baptist Theological Seminary, Rome, Italy. The doctor has promised to send THE MENACE some interesting facts soon about the papacy in its home. At present he is in this country, but expects soon to return to Rome.

From a religious standpoint, Italy does not present a very optimistic outlook. The Italians, owing to their enforced relations with the Vatican, are nominally Catholics, but millions of them have absolutely abandoned the church and embraced atheism. There are at least three reasons why there is so much unbelief with us. First, the exasperated conduct of many priests, monks, nuns and the higher clergy, has thoroughly disgusted respectable people of all classes. They naturally wish to have nothing to do with a church whose representatives are no better than the average worldling.

Secondly, men of intelligence cannot accept as true such doctrines as papal infallibility, transubstantiation, purgatory, annular confession, mariology, the worship of relics and saints and similar absurd teachings. Thirdly, the hostile attitude of the Roman Church toward modern science and philosophy has driven many of Italy's most noted men away from the Roman Church. Learned Italians have not forgotten the treatment which Galileo and Giordano Bruno received from the Roman Church, nor are they unmindful of the fact that Roman Catholic Italy, France and Spain have more infidels to the population than any other countries in Christendom.

The recent suppression of four popes by Pius X has made no small stir in clerical circles. Their names are Boniface VI, Boniface VII, John XVI, and Benedict X. These names have appeared for centuries in the official lists of the popes published by the Vatican. They are to be seen also in beautiful medallions in St. Paul's Church in Rome where all the popes, from St. Peter to the present incumbent, are visible. Pius X, however, has forgotten to tell us why he cancelled these names. Only two reasons could be given, either unworthiness or an illegal election. If these were his criticisms, then why did he not cancel forty instead of four names? Why should he leave on the official list the names of Vigilius who

stared his predecessor, Sylvester, to death; Sergius III, who became the father of Pope John XI by an infamous woman; of John XII elected Pope at 12 years of age, who was cruel, sanguinary and a homicide; of Basileus VIII, the first one who dared call himself the Vicar of Christ; of the notorious Alexander VI, the father of the unrepentable Caesar Borgia, and many others who obtained the papal throne by intrigue, graft and even fouler means! In view of such inexcusable acts, the Italian public is wondering whether god or the loss of France or modernism has unsettled the Pope's mind.

Let us not falsely conclude that the punishment, humiliation and persecution to which these illustrious men, not to mention hundreds of others less noted, have been shamelessly subjected, signifies the arrest of the movement. Not at all! Modernism is more alive than ever, especially in Italy. It is a well known fact that when a heretic is killed either literally or figuratively to others rises up in his place. This has actually happened in Italy. Genesaro Avolio, who edits the "New Reform" has a following of about 600 priests not to count a multitude of laymen. Domenico Batinai has an equal following. Murri has even more. Minocchi at the University of Pisa has many friends among the cultured clergy, most of whom are also radicals. Not long since a hundred signed by more than 5,000 priests asking to be relieved from the vow of celibacy was in vain presented to the Pope. These facts go far to prove beyond a doubt that modernism is a living issue that must be reckoned with, not only by the Vatican, but by all who labor for the truth in Roman Catholic countries where modernism has had its greatest triumphs.

Crippling a Nation

Scientific data compiled from the records of the French army reveal the remarkable fact that the average French soldier of today is two inches less in stature than the French soldier of a hundred years ago. People whose attention is called to this naturally wonder why it is so; and, as usual, those who fear the truth charge it all to the French revolution or the wars. But an investigation of the condition in France following the revocation of the Edict of Nantes reveals the real reason so plainly that no one need doubt the one and inevitable conclusion.

That famous edict of Henry IV, made in 1598, established religious liberty in France for the eighty-seven years it was in force. Under its beneficent provisions commerce developed, industry thrived and the French people were happy. But in 1685 Louis XIV. revoked the great edict and the Huguenots became the prey of the Romish heretic hunters.

The Inquisition was set up and carried out with such vigor as to impoverish the Huguenots, and when the unhappy Huguenot had no more wealth for his bloody inquisitors, they took his life, murdered his wife and children, inflicting the most horrible tortures. Those who were able to do so fled from France to England or America or to the German principalities which were ruled by sovereigns wise enough to welcome honest and industrious immigrants. The Elector of Brandenburg opened his arms to the fugitives, gave them places on his estates where they might labor and worship without fear or interference.

The effect of this was to depopulate whole districts of France. The workings ruined their religion, espoused that of Rome, and were permitted to remain. From them have come the inferior generations that were unable to permanently enlarge the map of France even under the guidance of the brilliant Napoleon.

Even a hundred years ago, when the French soldier was two inches taller than today, the blood of the French nation had deteriorated and its population was on the down grade. It was then that Napoleon finished what had already begun, and sacrificed what was left of French vigor on the battlefield. But the foundation of France had already been destroyed or driven away. The strong, conscientious and high spirited Huguenots had died rather than accept under the yoke of Rome, or had abandoned home and country to seek peace elsewhere. So it was that Germany got a fresh infusion of blood from France that made it victorious over the third Napoleon. Rome absolutely abandoned the church and embraced atheism.
