Synopsis of The Battle-Born

The leading characters in this powerful historical romance of the Reformation period are: Sir Percy Heathley, the hero, known as the White Knight, who though an ardent upholder of the papacy, in a royal tournament defends Lady Klare Wentworth, who had been charged with heresy. Sir Percy triumphs and Lady Klare for the moment was thus vindicated. He is leader of the ultra-papal forces both in the crusade to stamp out heresy and also for the rigid maintenance of the dogma that the pope is supreme and above all earthly kings—a theory which has become disastrous to King Henry VIII, who is rapidly approaching a rupture with the holy see. The Abbot of the Wood, the Black Knight, Lord Fitzhugh, ardent supporter of Cardinal Wolsey's reactionary policy. Lord Fitzhugh, though an ardent papist, is a suitor for the hand of Lady Klare Wentworth. Sir John Dudley is an intimate of Cardinal Wolsey and is considered one of the most beautiful, pure-hearted and gifted women of the court of Henry VIII, but according to Wolsey she is a heretic, and at heart a martyr of the Reformation. She is the wife of a man, it is suspected of heresy, but still enjoys the favor of King Henry.

Lady Elizabeth, a rival of Lady Klare of whom she is intensely jealous. She is a fanatical Romanist, a convert of Queen Mary and Cardinal Wolsey and one of the leaders in the pending proposed campaign to crush heresy throughout England by the methods of the Spanish Inquisition. The fanatical and diabolical plan of Cardinal Wolsey and Queen Mary, Father Solero has been imported from Spain at the discovery of the new method.

After a vivid description of a royal tournament in which the White Knight defeats Lady Klare and under a truce of arms the Protestant Reformation is spreading in some sections like wildfire. Heresy is also spreading in the continent of Europe.

After the Star Chamber meeting Cardinal Wolsey induces Sir Percy Heathley to promise to go to Germany and suppress the heretics. Martin Luther, insisting that in this way alone could the spread of heresy be checked. But before the knight sets out for the continent, Lady Klare and her friends, who are with him, during which she eloquently pleads the cause of Protestantism. Unfortunately there are reasons to believe that she has been overheard by one of the spies of Wolsey.

After certain meetings with Lady Chester Sir Percy's fanatical zeal for the holy father and the Roman church is again fanned to flame and he sets out to rid the world of Luther and receive the papal blessing.

Sir Percy reaches the continent and near Wittenberg without mishap. Here he overtake the English knight, who is rapidly losing his beauty and attractiveness; apparently a student who is also bound for Wittenberg. While the two are crossing the young knight's horse takes fright and crowds Sir Percy's horse off the stone balustrade into the Rhine. The English knight, who is injured and is borne by the youthful rider and some Wittenberg students into one of the latter's quarters where he is being nursed back to health by the young knight and the German students.

During his extended illness the knight is influenced in favor of the great reformer by his host and Blount.

The discussion ends leaving Sir Percy very much impressed, but his perturbed state of mind makes him rather savage. However upon Blount's return he persuades him to accompany him to Rome to investigate the papacy at its fountain head.

Arriving at the Eternal City they immediately engaged quarters. One night after a day of research they repaired to the Coliseum where in the moonlight and amid the ruins they met the young knight, a true Christian hero who portrays to them the corruption of papal Rome quite as vividly and strongly as did Luther.

Would He send out troops to hunt for blood because He had been spoken against? All this burned its way into Percy's consciousness, while his abhorrence of the system, as well as his own crass bigotry in defending it, filled him with a smothering disgust. What a monstrous deception had been imposed on the human race; what wickedness practiced in the name of God. He shuddered and put away the thought.

Again the baying of the dog came to them with a thrill of horror * * * they were being trailed by bloodhounds. For a moment they stood listening to the sound drawing nearer. Blount instinctively came close to Heathley, and the Knight drew his sword.

"Ah, my holy father, Lord Pope, Chief Vicar of Christ over the church! So this is the way you and your children manifest the love of God to us? I, who have faced death a thousand times for you and your interests. I who made my battle-cry the Virgin and Saint George, and who stained my hands with the blood of men that your interests might be secured in the earth, am paid by being hunted with dogs through the wilderness? And why? Am I not cleaner, saner and better than when glorying in war and crime because I thought it was the will of God? Well have the Reformers declared you the Man of Sin, the Antichrist, and your system the world's one great blight."

Would Put Censor Over the Vatican

The Christian Advocate, published in New York, an issue of which has just arrived at our exchange table, has a very terse and pertinent editorial on the papal ambition for a wireless station on St. Peter's dome. We quote it in part as follows:

"THE VATICAN NEEDS A CENSOR"

"The establishment of a wireless station on the dome of Saint Peter's in Rome has been suggested to the vatican, so that it may obtain independent transmission of foreign messages of diplomatic character in code, and also receive confidential and reliable reports from the vatican's representatives abroad."

"The above dispatch from Italy appeared in many American papers last Friday. It has a strange and sinister sound, coming at a time when the calamitous retirement of the Italian army according to credible sources traceable in some degree to 'clerical influences,' that is, to Roman Catholic pro-Austrian propaganda."

"The dispatch goes on to say: 'While the vatican has not complained to the Italian government regarding telegraphic communication, it is assumed that the censor use ordinary precautions. During the war the majority of the confidential messages from the pope or Cardinal Gasparri, the papal secretary of state, have been sent by special courier. Lesser messages have been sent by mail.'

"Italy is a democracy, but over against the palace of its citizen king is the vatican court, the abode of the most anti-democratic power in the world, which, in the name of religion, seeks the same dominion which the German autocracy demands in the name of commerce. Self-aggrandizement is the object of both. One uses force to spread its Kultur, the other craft. Both hoped, and perhaps still hope, to be the gainers by this world-disturbance. One has no more sympathy with democracy than the other. What messages can it be that the so-called 'Vicar of Christ' is sending, that cannot be trusted to any honest man to read? Would not the Christ, who is so misrepresented at Rome, be moved with indignation if He should surprise His scheming 'Vicar' at his plots, and overturn his wireless apparatus, as He did the tables of the money-changers in another house which was dedicated to the worship of His Father, but which in His opinion, had been degraded to base uses?"

The Pope in Jerusalem?

"Of all the fool propositions which have recently been given currency in the Catholic, and in some secular papers, that is most idiotic which demands that the allies now set up the papal throne in Jerusalem, recently captured by the British. One Italian paper strongly urges it in an editorial for the somewhat incongruous reason that the pope has been a nuisance where he is, being opposed to every struggle of the Italians for a constitutional government, and is known by them to have been in no small degree responsible for the traitorous retreat and surrender of the Italian army in Venetia. The editor adds the curious comment that 'another reason' for moving the pope from Rome is because 'the vatican is now only another name for the Jesuit.' However much it might relieve Italy to get rid of a resident foe and pestilent plotter, it need not be feared that the two great Protestant nations, England and the United States, not to speak of France, whose freedom from papal domination was accomplished after more than a hundred years of conflict, will ever consent to place the pope where he will have a free hand to further the interests of Germany. The *Aviator* remembers that when in the days of Pius IX, he spent a winter in Rome, he had to go 'outside the walls' to worship God in the Bible way. England has not fought her way through the walls of Jerusalem to turn the city over to an ecclesiastical despotism which, once installed, would shut the gates upon the worship of her sons."—*Aviator in The Presbyterian*, Jan. 3, 1918.

The Cardinal's Dilemma

If Cardinal Gibbons, in calling upon the people of this country to give a responsive ear to any peace proposal the Central Powers might make, was speaking for the pope as the head of the Catholic church, he proves that the pope is for Germany and against the United States. In this case both the pope and Cardinal Gibbons should be repudiated by the whole American people irrespective of name or sect.

If he spoke for the American hierarchy and not by the authority of the pope, then he and the hierarchy should be condemned both by the pope and the American people.

If he only spoke for himself and gave utterance to his own sentiments, then he should be repudiated by all loyal Catholics and Protestants and treated as any other pro-German of position and influence.

Ambition, bluster and charity, so-called, are the A. B. C.'s of popery.

The Knights of Columbus war fund, started with rising ambitions as to making the order popular, is having the opposite effect. The aid so seemingly magnanimously offered the government has really been shown to be working as a sort of union of church and state for which the people of San Francisco have, making liking. After reading the fact-pointed out by ministers of that city as printed in this issue there will be people elsewhere who will wish to testify to the correctness of the San Francisco position.
