
## FEEDING WHEAT TO CHICKENS

### Exercise Given Hens in Scratching Out Grain is Conducive to Egg Laying at All Times.

Last year, being short of hay and having only a small wheat crop, we cut all our wheat with the mower and put it up for hay, harvesting it a few days before the regular wheat harvesting time.

Our wheat-hay stored in the barn was fed to the horses from the time it was harvested till late in the winter when it was all used up. Incidentally, it proved to be one of the best horse feeds we ever used. But the chickens had the run of the barn and lots, picking up and scratching out all scattered wheat.

As soon as our wheat was in the barn and its feeding began, the hens began immediately to lay more eggs than usual. They continued to lay unusually well all summer, fall and through the winter till the wheat-hay was all fed out and gone. Within less than a week after this wheat-hay was gone our hens dropped in their egg yield noticeably and they did not come back to a heavy yield in spring till we reluctantly purchased wheat at \$1.60 a bushel and began to feed this grain.

Then they did come back to their former high yield.

The hens lay enough more eggs when fed on wheat to make the wheat bring even better than war prices for grain. They seem to do much better, too, when they are given wheat in the straw, or bundle, than when given the pure thrashed grain. It seems that the exercise they get in scratching it out is conducive to egg laying.

## SOME TROUBLES OF TURKEYS

### Common Cause of Disease Termed Chicken Pox is Overfeeding With Corn—It Congests Liver.

Turkeys are sometimes infected with a disease which might be termed chicken pox—a condition in which the heads become covered with large, yellow sores, which discharge a little and form scabs, giving the birds a most unwholesome appearance, writes I. B. Henderson in Farm, Stock and Home. This is a form of scrofula, and it seems to spread from one bird to another, so that it needs to be dealt with on definite lines.

We believe a common cause of this to be overfeeding with corn, which, in spite of advice to the contrary, still remains a favorite food for turkeys with many farmers; but it overheats the system, and, being of a starchy nature, tends to congest the liver even of young stock. The blood in this way becomes filled with impurities, for the simple reason that the digestive processes cannot be properly carried out, and these eruptions, especially if the birds get inoculated with the complaint from some other source, will appear and will work untold mischief.

The only way to deal with this is to separate the birds, bathe the sores as they appear with a fairly strong solution of permanganate of potash, paint with disinfectant, dose the bird with epsom salts, and keep on a fairly low diet. Such a treatment will give the bird a set-back so far as fleshing is concerned, but it is absolutely necessary to follow out such a treatment if the trouble is to be checked.

## Money Well Spent.

Each year, as trap nesting is practiced, better returns will be obtained from fewer hens. It is important. The time spent in looking after these nests is the best expenditure on the poultry farm. It is money well spent. But, as already mentioned, it is equally important to use males, in mating, that came from hens that did good work.

## Wheat for Laying Hens.

Wheat in the shed is not only one of the very best feeds for laying hens, but it is very good for little chickens and young growing stock. We cut wheat for all our poultry as soon as grain is formed, and continue the feeding for all the year. There is nothing better for the birds. Wheat in the straw in the hen house in winter furnishes both grain and scratching litter of the best kinds. It pays to feed wheat if you want lots of eggs for all seasons.

## Where Green Feed is Limited.

If the fowls have little range, give them a head or so of cabbage every day. Hang the cabbage up where they can peck at it as they desire. In this way whole heads will speedily be consumed without any waste whatever.

## Object in Trap-Nesting.

Some breeders do not trap-nest the hens, only the pullets. This is especially the case on large farms. They trap in order to make their selection for the coming season.

## HARMFUL LITTLE PEST

### Clover Louse Plays Havoc With Crops in the East.


Big, Green, Long-Legged Insect Has Ruined Millions of Dollars' Worth of Crops—Alfalfa Seems to Be Immune.

The clover louse was, in all probability, introduced with clover and peas from Europe, where it is widely distributed and common. It is chiefly a pest on peas in the eastern part of the United States. In the middle and western states it is a pest on clover.

The aphid has done immense damage to peas and clovers. It affects especially leguminous plants, but numbers also among its food plants many weeds. The most important of its food plants are red clover, crimson clover, field pea, sweet pea, vetches (known also as "tares"), beets, lettuce, shepherd's purse, and nettle and other weeds. Alfalfa seems to be immune from attack. Thirty sweeps of the net in red clover yielded 3,000 of the aphids, while the same number of




Leaves of Clover Showing Characteristic Injury by the Clover Curculionid.

similar sweeps in an adjoining field of alfalfa gave only 39. On soy beans growing next to heavily infested clover, not a single louse was found.

Where peas are grown the aphid winters in a field of clover or on weeds (as a wingless female or as an egg), and in spring is confined to these until the peas start to grow, and then it does not get to the early varieties, though it devastates the late-sown peas. The first aphids select the youngest leaves and shoots, but eventually the live over the entire plant and sap out its life, rendering it unfit even for fodder.

Several years ago, in Wisconsin, the louse was noticed in a 50-acre field of peas about July 20; in less than a week all the plants were dead and brown. In Maryland the louse destroyed peas valued at \$5,000,000 in one year.

The most important enemy of this louse is a common fungus, Empusa aphidis. It is widespread in the United States and Canada, and affects a great variety of aphids. It does not appear in dry weather but is common after a rain or two at any time during the growing season, but is most abundant

dant under the combined influences of moisture and warmth. Then it sweeps off myriads of aphids.

The clover louse is affected directly or indirectly by a large number of insects, about thirty-three in all. The most important of these appears to be the ladybird beetle. The larvae of this insect destroy immense numbers of these aphids.

## TREATING WHEAT FOR SMUT

### Grain Soaked for Twelve Hours in Solution of "Copper Sulphate and Water" is Effective.

The copper sulphate or "blue vitriol" method of treating wheat for smut is to dissolve one pound of copper sulphate in each 25 gallons of water used in the treatment and soak the grain 12 hours in this solution, stirring it occasionally, after which it is immersed for a few minutes in lime water made by adding ten gallons of water to one pound of fresh slaked lime. This last treatment is given to avoid injuring the power of germination of the grain.

## Overcrowded Hens.

Overcrowding is the cause of a great many troubles. Overcrowding makes overfat hens and overfat hens lay soft-shelled eggs, and the egg-eating that follows. Overcrowded flocks will roost closer together at night and sweat, leaving them in a weakened condition resulting in sickness. Overcrowding also produces idlers. Idle hens become mischievous hens and the disgusting vice of feather pulling is the result.

## Care for Young Animals.

The colts and calves are worth good money. It is up to the owner to make them worth the best money possible. They should not stop growing. Good shelter and feed will bring good returns.

## SHIPPING SHEEP TO MARKET

### Exercise Care That Animals Will Appear to Best Advantage on Arrival at Their Destination.

In shipping sheep or lambs to market care should be taken to handle them so they will appear to best advantage at the time of sale. The car in which they are shipped should be well bedded with dry straw or some other material which is its equivalent for keeping the animal clean. It is not necessary to give each sheep or lamb in the car more space than enough to stand comfortably, but overcrowding should be avoided. In hot weather especially, overcrowding results in losses. At this time losses are likely to result from mixing lambs in with older sheep, because the lambs often succumb from being crowded in between animals larger than themselves.

At the time of shipment the fleeces of sheep or lambs should be dry. If they are wet it is difficult to keep them clean in appearance even though the car be well bedded. If they are very wet when they reach the market buyers do not like to bid on them, and if they do they are likely to allow for the moisture in the wool by offering less for them than if they were dry.

It at the time of shipment, some of the sheep or lambs are foul behind

from dung being lodged in the wool, it is well to clip this soiled wool off before they are loaded. This should be done because the close crowding in the car causes the sheep that are foul to soil the sides of those that are clean. There are also other reasons for clipping away this soiled wool. It detracts from the appearance of the animals and from their value when considerable in amount.

## FREE SHEEP FROM MAGGOTS

### Wool Should Be Clipped to Skin and Spot Treated With a Weak Solution of Tar Dip.

Whenever a sheep has a filthy spot on any part of its body or when it continually twists about and bites the wool in a certain place it should be examined for maggots. The wool should be clipped to the skin if found infested and the spot treated with a weak solution of coal tar dip.

If maggots have already lodged in the muscles use a solution quite strong. Pour the medicine over the infested part and work it into the holes made by the maggots. They will soon come wriggling out. Turpentine, which is sometimes used for this purpose, is harsh in its action and is not recommended on humane grounds.

## REASONABLE CARE FOR SHEEP

### Most of Success With Flock Lies With Increase—Pastures Help Out Feeding Problem.

To make the most of sheep one must give them reasonable care at least. Most of the profit lies in the success with the increase, and if they are allowed to go through the summer in poor, scrawny condition, it will take more feed to finish them in the fall, and the ones that are kept for breeding stock will be unfit to start into the winter.

Our green pastures will help us out greatly in feeding them, and in the fall we will have our green corn and perhaps sorghum to feed, but no matter how plentiful the feed, we should not fail to supply them with plenty of clean water.

## Good Live Stock.

It makes farming permanent. It returns highest price for farm crops. It furnishes market for waste feeds. It reduces bulk of marketable crops. It distributes labor throughout the year.

It means cleaner farms. It makes income steady. It helps to keep boys on the farm. It makes farm life more pleasant.

## Grinding Grain for Horses.

Many farmers do not care to grind all the grain their teams eat, neither do they care to take the trouble to cut up all their forage and then to sprinkle it and mix ground stuff with it, but that practice will pay in the case of aged animals whose teeth are past repair.

Many hold the idea that sheep will consume and flourish on the waste of the farm without additional feeds. This is not exactly the case, for nothing responds more readily to good care than sheep, and with such care a small flock does not only prove a profitable investment but a pleasant occupation as well.
