## Mrs. Elizabeth B. Jenkins.

Slater Hustler.

Mrs. Elizabeth B. Jenkins, wife of Judge Richard H. Jenkins, died at her home in Slater Wednesday, September 25th, 1901, at 6:19 p. m.

Funeral services were conducted by Rev. O. S. Russell at the Baptist church Thursday afternoon at 4 o'clock and her remains were interred in the City cemetery.

Her death was the result of blood poison. About two months ago a small sore appeared on one of her fingers, which received prompt medical attention, but gradually grew worse until her entire system was involved.

Mrs. Jenkins was a devoted Christian lady, whose life, which has been spent in this locality, was one that has wielded an influence in the upbuilding of religious and moral sentiment. She was converted to the cause of Christ in the springtime of her life and has ever been true and steadfast in the faith. Her life has been one of devotion to her God, her family and her friends. Profound sympathy is felt for her devoted husband and children in this hour of sorrow.

The deceased was a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Y. Thomson, who were among the early settlers of Missouri. Mr. Thomson came to this state in 1818 on a visit to Howard county, returned and located near Slater in 1825, where he raised a family of ten children, four of whom survive, Mrs. W. G. Fowler, Mrs. Howard Ford and A. W. Thomson, of Saline county and Robert K. Thomson, of Pettis county.

Mrs. Jenkins was born on February 5, 1833, and was married on the 5th of February 1855, to R. H. Jenkins. Their union was blessed with five children, four of whom are living, Robert T., George G. Asa Jenkins, and Mrs. Peyton R. Powell. The other child was the late Mrs. Wm. Robinson.

The deceased was one of the eight persons who organized the Rehoboth Baptist church in 1850. Mrs. Lucy Field, of this city, and W. E. Thomson, of Austin, Texas, being the only ones of the number now living.
