17 CHOSEN FOR M. U. INDOOR TRACK TEAM

Tigers To Meet Jayhawkers In Kansas City Friday Night.

FRESHMEN WILL RUN RELAY

Coach Monilaw Thinks Contest Will Be Hard Fought Throughout.

The seventeen men who are to represent the University of Missouri in the annual indoor track meet against the University of Kansas in Convention Hall in Kansas City next Friday night, were announced this afternoon. Besides the Varsity team five freshmen will go to Kansas City to run in the mile relay race against the freshmen team of the University of Kansas. The men who will compose the team and the events in which they are entered follow:

50-yard dash: H. C. Farrell, G. C. Houston, and E. C. Robinson.
One-mile run: J. C. Snyder, E. T. Steele, and O. R. Johnson.
55-yard high hurdles: O. A. Herzog (captain), L. A. Simpson, and N. C. Farrell.
440-run: E. C. Robinson, Lester Bermond, G. B. Shuck, and H. C. Farrell.
Half-mile run: E. M. Tipton, C. H. Talbot, and Lester Bermond.
55-yard low hurdles: O. A. Herzog, L. A. Simpson, and H. C. Farrell.
Two-mile run: E. T. Steele, J. C. Snyder, and O. R. Johnson.
Mile relay: H. C. Farrell, Lester Bermond, G. B. Shuck, E. C. Robinson, M. S. Neal, and G. C. Houston.
Shot-put: Edgar Anderson and Elmer Anderson.
High Jump: O. A. Herzog, Devinna. Guy Kirksey, E. W. Knoble, Samuel Perry and Frank Catron will compose the freshman relay team. J. C. Mills will go as an alternate.

"I expect the meet to be hard-fought until the finish of the relay race," said W. J. Monilaw, coach of the University of Missouri track team, this afternoon. "Kansas has a good team this year. Coach Hamilton has developed star track men who have been hitherto unknown. We have never been beaten by Kansas in an indoor meet, however.

"The quarter-mile run should be the most interesting of the meet. Both Haddock of Kansas and Bermond of Missouri are crack quarter-milers."

FOR A NAZARENE UNIVERSITY

Pentecostal Church to Spend One Million Dollars in California.

A Nazarene University, costing one million dollars, is to be built by the Pentecostal church of the Nazarene. It will be located on a site recently purchased in the Northeastern part of Pasadena and will be one of the most imposing groups of buildings ever erected in Southern California.

The site consists of 134 acres of the famous HUGUS ranch at the foothills northeast of Pasadena. This property was bought by the Nazarene church several months ago for \$165,000. It has been platted, streets are being surveyed and arrangement completed for parking and terracing the entire acreage.

Dr. P. F. Breese, a well known Nazarene clergyman, to whom great credit is given for acquiring the land and arranging for the elaborate improvements, is the general superintendent of the project.—Los Angeles Examiner.

SMALLPOX CASES ARE MILD

Several Are Being Vaccinated Each Day at Parker Memorial Hospital.

The Columbia police say that the cases of smallpox in the city are now well under control. John L. Whitesides, chief of the Columbia police force, said this morning.

"We have only eight cases under quarantine now and there have been no new cases for some time. I believe that we have the disease stamped out. Only one white man has been quarantined. All the cases are mild. If it were not for spreading the disease the victims could be at work as well as not.

About four or five persons are being vaccinated each day at the Parker Memorial hospital, and the physicians in town are making many others immune.
