WILL SELL TICKETS FOR JOPLIN GAME

Seats May be Procured of Prof. W.G. Manly Last of Next Week.

EXCURSION WILL BE RUN

Rate of \$8.50 Will Go Into Effect the Wednesday Before Contest.

Those who desire to buy tickets to the Missouri-Oklahoma football game at Joplin October 28 can obtain them from Prof. W. G. Manly the last of next week. Only the box seats will be reserved. The grand-stand seats will be on sale in Joplin for a week before the game.

The game will be played at the ball park, which has seating capacity for 6,000 persons. The Commercial club intends to erect new bleachers for at least another thousand persons. It is said that the grounds are very well adapted for a football field.

The excursion rate of \$8.50 will go into effect the Wednesday before the game and a number are planning to go Wednesday night. Any crowd of eighteen persons can obtain a Pullman car which will leave here at 11:30 at night and arrive in Joplin about 9 the next morning.

The railroad company will provide as many through cars as will be necessary to accommodate the crowd. There seems little chance of obtaining a better rate than \$8.50.

Carleton College at Farmington has an interesting history. Its founder was Miss E. A. Carleton, who is still living and taking part in the work of the school. Miss Carleton was a school teacher before the Civil War and determined to found a school for the education of boys and girls. In 1854 she had saved enough money to found the first school near Farmington. In 1859 the school was incorporated. It was one of the few schools during the war that did not have to close the doors. Miss Carleton kept her school running all the time that the war was going on, and besides this helped to nurse wounded soldiers. The school has been placed under the su-
