THE MISSOURI SADDLE HORSES.

Now the Missouri saddle horse is taking rank with the Missouri hen and the Missouri mule. Boone, Audrain and Callaway Counties are offering stakes at their county fairs which equal those given almost anywhere else.

The Audrain County fair, which is held in Mexico, heads the list with a \$1,500 sweepstake for five-gaited saddle horses. Boone County has two fairs, at Sturgeon and at Columbia, each offering stakes of \$1,000, while the Callaway County fair at New Bloomfield offers one of the same size.

The fairs follow each other and should bring to this part of Missouri a string of saddle horses that will be hard to equal. Good saddle horse stakes do more to advertise a county fair than almost anything else.

A NEW HOTEL.

Still there has been nothing done toward giving Columbia a new hotel. At present one is hardly large enough to accommodate our visitors. The cross-state highway brings many persons here to spend the night.

But Columbia's largest numbers of visitors come in the winter. From every part of the United States come men and women to visit Columbia and the University. A town is often judged by its hotels. Every person who travels and stays at hotels naturally meets men and the conversation turns to hotels.

Then it is the good hotel that comes in for a little word of praise. Incidentally the town in which it is located gets its share. Surely Columbia is progressive enough to have a really modern place for visitors.

FARMERS WANT CHOLERA SERUM

College of Agriculture Is Sending Out 1,000 Doses Each Day.

The College of Agriculture has been sending out 1,000 doses of cholera serum a day. This summer has been the first time the demand during the period, when the cholera is the worst, could be supplied. There are 30,000 doses in storage now.

The serum proved efficient last year, according to Dean F. B. Mumford. Of the 250,000 hogs inoculated last year, 85 per cent were saved.
