**WANTS A HARD SURFACE ROAD**  
**St. Louis Times Describes Condition on Old Trails Route.**  
In a recent issue the St. Louis Times makes this comment on the work of the State Highway Commission and the Old Trails Road:  
"The good work done by the commission can best be appreciated by making a trip across the state from St. Louis to Kansas City by way of St. Charles, Warrenton, Fulton, Columbia, Boonville, Marshall Lexington and Independence. This road is more frequently used than any other cross-state highway. It is about 305 miles in length and before the commission took charge more than one-third of the road was almost impassable. The entire distance has now been filled, leveled, graded and scraped, so that in dry weather it may be traveled in safety and with convenience. The same kind of work has been done on the southern highway, the cross-state road on the south side of the river, but both roads are sadly in need of surfacing."  
"The entire road to Kansas City over the Boon's Lick road and the Old Santa Fe trail, while approximately 305 miles in length and a safe and good dirt road for travel during fair and dry weather, is dangerous and almost impassable in wet weather, and for more than two-thirds of the distance less than one-fifth is rock or hard-surfaced road. Travel by automobile is utterly impossible at such times."  
"We suggest to the commission that instead of spending the entire roads appropriation in opening, leveling grading and scraping the dirt highways throughout the state, a sufficient sum be retained and expended for hard-surfacing at least one of the cross-state roads. The road over the Boon's Lick and Santa Fe Trail route would seemingly be preferred by a greater majority of motorists for this work. Reports from Jefferson City show that 139,566 automobiles have been licensed, and the revenue realized from that source ought to be sufficient to build at least one hard or surfaced cross-state highway. The travel across the state has been increased many fold since the commission improved the dirt road, and if the work were extended so as to make the highways safe for travel in all kinds of weather, the traffic would be many times greater."  
"The good roads work now being done should not be retarded or delayed, but, as stated, at least one hard or surfaced cross-state road should be constructed without delay, so as to invite and induce motorists crossing the continent to go and come, east or west, by way of St. Louis, Kansas City and Missouri."

### NO MILK DELIVERIES YET

Seven Kansas City Dealers Still Refuse to Supply City.

No deliveries had been made before noon today. It is reported the dairy-men sought to prevent a strike of teamsters by locking out the public.

### Half of State's Soils Tested.

One of the many activities of the University of Missouri College of Agriculture is conducting soil experiments. The college has conducted experiments in soil management on thirty different soil experiment fields representing most of the important soil types in Missouri. The results of these experiments coupled with the maps and soil analyses available from the soil survey work have made it possible to recommend systems of soil management for more than half the soil area of Missouri. Bulletins covering much of this experimental work have been published.
