NEGROES PLAN POLITICAL PARTY

New York State to Have a New Organization.

ALBANY, N. Y., Dec. 31.—New York state will soon have a new state political organization, composed entirely of negroes. Whether the organization will oppose or join with either of the old line parties has not yet been determined. The purpose of the organization is primarily to protect and advance the interests of the colored man in the state.

According to J. W. Thompson of this city, who is heading the movement, there will be 300,000 negro voters in the organization, and an unofficial convention will be called next May.
