A preliminary announcement of the population of Boone County just received from the Bureau of Census by C. W. Davis, county clerk, gives the 1920 population of each city, town and village of the county as follows: Columbia, 10,379; Ashland, 342; Centralia, 2,071; Hallsville, 225; Harrisburg, 163; Hartsburg, 211; Rochepoort, 458, and Sturgeon, 728.


