State Meeting Will Be Held in November.  
A special effort is being made to arrange a program for the November meeting of the Missouri State Teachers' Association that will appeal to all classes of teachers and the School and Community, issued by the association. The speakers have been selected with all the teachers in mind. In addition to the general meetings, a special program is being prepared for Friday afternoon for the three great divisions of teachers, rural, elementary, and high school. Special speakers have been secured for each of these groups. Miss Theda Gildemeister and Dr. W. H. Kilpatrick will address the general meeting and also bring a special message to elementary teachers. Doctor Kilpatrick is today exerting great influence in the field of elementary school methods. Miss Omalia Bengston, a leader in rural education will address the rural teachers. Dr. Thomas Balliet, dean of the School of Education of the University of New York City, will address the rural teachers. Doctor Balliet will address the general meeting on training for citizenship. Dr. M. L. Burton, president of the University of Michigan, will address the general meeting on the live topic of "Being Alive."  
Other strong speakers selected for the general and special programs are Dr. L. D. Coffman, president, University of Minnesota.
