

TIGERS DEFEAT DRAKE U. TEAM BY 10-7 SCORE

Fullbright Makes Touchdown in Second Quarter After Lewis Takes Long Forward Pass.

BLUMER BADLY INJURED

Lewis Hurt and Packwood Goes in at Quarter—Fullbright Kicks Field Goal.

DRAKE FIELD, DES MOINES, Ia., Oct. 23.—The Missouri Tigers defeated Drake here this afternoon, 10 to 7.

DRAKE STADIUM, DES MOINES, Ia., Oct. 23.—A cloudless sky and a gentle breeze greeted the Tigers as they trotted on to a muddy field at 2:15 o'clock this afternoon.

The Bulldogs appeared on the field at 2:30 o'clock and were given a drizzling ovation by the crowds that filled the stadium.

CAPTAIN LEWIS KICKS OFF

Captain Lewis opened the game by kicking to Shearer in the shadow of the goal posts, who returned the ball to the line but a Missouri forward was offside.

On the next play Drake was penalized 5 yards for false start. A long forward pass from the hands of Brindley was incomplete.

Brindley punted 45 yards to Fullbright, who returned the ball to mid-field but fumbled the ball upon being tackled.

Shearer failed to gain in two attempts. Another pass from Brindley was not completed.

In returning the ball Fullbright was caught landing and the Tigers were penalized 5 yards.

Brindley attempted a forward pass which was blocked by the Tigers.

Brindley skirted right end for 15 yards, running out of bounds, and then went through center for 3 yards more.

LOSERS BALL ON 1-YARD LINE

Lewis got off a beautiful 50-yard punt in Brindley, who came back 17 yards.

Fullbright circled the left end and evaded the Drake forwards and carried the ball 43 yards to Drake's 6-yard line.

Lewis gained 4 yards around right end, but on another attempt failed.

Standing behind his own goal Brindley punted to Fullbright, who was downed on Drake's 35-yard line.

At the opening of the second quarter Long went in for Woodhead.

Lewis passed to Williams 5 yards. Williams was good for 2 yards, and Humes went through the line for 5, placing the ball on Drake's 7-yard line.

Lewis gained 5 yards around left end. Williams broke through left tackle for 17 yards.

Lewis and Williams both failed to gain. Fullbright passed to Lewis who carried the ball within 1 yard of the goal line.

On the next play Fullbright bucked center and carried the ball over for a touchdown.





FIND FOURTH WHISKY STILL IN COLUMBIA

Turner S. Gordon Confesses That He Destroyed Small Outfit of His Own Accord.

THIRD FOUND YESTERDAY

R. E. Little Delivers It to City Police—Was Made by a Columbia Mechanic.

A fourth whisky still has been found in Columbia.

A small still existed two months ago in the basement of a cafe operated by Turner S. Gordon, 106 South Ninth street.

Mr. Gordon has made a written confession which, according to a reliable authority, is in the hands of the county prosecutor awaiting the arrival in Columbia of prohibition officers from St. Louis.

Word was received here yesterday that all prohibition officials in St. Louis are at present confined to that city as witnesses on cases now being heard in the court of Judge C. B. Fair.

GORDON'S STILL WAS SMALL

The Gordon still cost about \$20. It was capable of about one quart of whisky an hour.

R. E. Little, owner of a plumbing shop at 17 North Tenth street, had a still in the rear of his plumbing store and admitted the fact to the city and county authorities.
