

ARRANGEMENTS ALL COMPLETE FOR BIG RALLY

600 Alumni and Students Expected at Gathering in St. Louis Next Friday Evening.

GOV. A. M. HYDE TO TALK Parade Planned for Saturday Morning at 10—Tickets for Game May Be Obtained Here.

Plans for 600 alumni and students of the University of Missouri are being made by the St. Louis Alumni Association for the rally dinner to be given in St. Louis at 6:30 o'clock Friday night at the American Annex. The message was received yesterday by R. L. Hill, University alumni recorder, by a telephone call from Dr. H. H. Shackelford, president of the St. Louis Alumni Association.

Governor Arthur M. Hyde and Acting President J. C. Jones will be the principal speakers at the dinner and the University students will be represented by the Mizou Razers and the Cadet Band, supported by as many students as are able to make the trip to St. Louis this week.

The Board of Curators of the University have been invited and a number already have promised to attend. The attendance will no doubt also be increased through the fact that there will be many Missouri alumni in St. Louis for the Stat Teachers' Association.

Those students who wish to make reservations for the rally dinner may do so by communicating with J. Max McCann, student president. The tickets will cost \$1.

A parade through the downtown section of St. Louis has been planned for 10:30 o'clock Saturday morning, and will include the University Cadet Band, the Razers and the members of the Thundering Thousand that are in St. Louis for the game.

Wives and friends of Missouri alumni or students have been especially invited to attend the rally dinner Friday night.

Dr. J. C. Jones to attend

Dr. J. C. Jones, acting president of the University, will leave Friday morning for St. Louis to be present at the meeting for Missouri alumni, former students and students at the American Annex Hotel Friday evening, and the Missouri Washington football game Saturday. "Personal interest is being aroused in the University among the St. Louis alumni, as is the case among alumni throughout the State," Doctor Jones said today.

Doctor Jones explained that the rally was to foster a renewed spirit of interest and relationship between the students now in the University and the alumni and to arouse in the latter a true interest in their alma mater.

Governor Arthur M. Hyde will be guest of honor at the dinner. The price of the meal will be no more than at any other place in St. Louis, according to Doctor Jones. Every student who goes to St. Louis for the game is cordially invited to attend.

PARADE PLANS CHANGED The parade of the Missouri delegation in St. Louis Saturday morning will start at 10 o'clock from the corner of Twelfth and Pine streets instead of from the Statler Hotel as has been previously announced.

The Wabash Railroad is offering special rates of fare and a third on all round-trip tickets which amounts to \$5 plus the war tax, good on all trains Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

The football team, band and razers will leave Columbia at 9:30 o'clock Friday morning. A meeting of the Razers was held last night to complete plans for the

stunt that will be put on at the game Saturday. The band will play at a mass meeting of alumni and students of the University to be held at the American Annex Friday night.

A concert will be given at the Odeon Theater for the Missouri State Teachers' Association Saturday morning. The band will also play for the parade and football game following.

It had been planned to give this concert at the various high schools of the city, as was done last year, but due to a school holiday, the program will instead be given for the teachers.

SEATS FOR GAME ON SALE Tickets for the Missouri-Washington game, which will be called at 2:30 o'clock Saturday, are on sale at Rothwell Gymnasium. Only reserved bleacher seats can be purchased here and the price is \$1. The seats this year are in a much better location than they were two years ago. The Missouri section Saturday will be the two middle sections of the South grandstand at Francis Field. Box seats will be on sale at the gates, at \$2.50.

Tickets for the game may also be obtained at the rally dinner Friday night or boxes may be reserved by calling Grand 4683 in St. Louis.

HILL TO ST. LOUIS MEETING Will Confer With Normal School And University Delegates.

R. L. Hill, University alumni recorder, left yesterday for St. Louis to attend a meeting of delegates from the five state teachers colleges and the University of Missouri whose purpose is to outline a constructive policy for the alumni associations in these institutions to follow in regard to the forming of the new Missouri State Constitution.

Four delegates from each alumni association of the five normal schools of the state and four from the University of Missouri will comprise the personnel of the meeting, which was to be in the form of a luncheon at noon today in the Hotel Statler.

Speeches were made by R. L. Hill, Prof. C. H. McClure of the Central Missouri State Teachers' College at Warrensburg; George Melcher, assistant superintendent of public schools in Kansas City; and E. M. Carter, secretary of the State Teachers' Association.

Wayman Goes to Jefferson City.

H. S. Wayman, secretary of the Missouri State Horticultural Society, went to Jefferson City yesterday to complete final arrangements for the Fifty-Fourth Annual Meeting of the State Horticultural Society which will be held in Hannibal on December 1, 2 and 3. Mr. Wayman has been here in conference with V. R. Gardner, professor of horticulture, over plans for the association. The Mississippi Valley Apple Growers' Association will meet in joint session with the Horticultural Society. An apple show will be staged at this meeting in which suitable cash premiums will be paid. The State Horticultural Society is planning for a joint meeting with the horticulture department during Farmers' Week.
