Population of Graveyard Is Equal to That of Columbia

Quaint old churchyards, shaded by ancient trees and strewn with broken tomb stones, moss-covered, with the weight of centuries weighing down upon them, have been favorite themes of poets. The Columbia Cemetery also has an interesting history.

In 1820 when the town of Columbia was laid out, six town lots of the usual size, 80 by 142 1/2 feet, in the south west corner of the plat, were set aside for a common burying ground. They were lots numbered 1, 2, 3, 64, 65 and 66. Here the people of Columbia were buried for 38 years. In those days before hearses and metal coffins, the dead were carried from the town to the graveyard, as it was called, by the pall bearers. It was the custom for men to carry large silk bandana pocket handkerchiefs. Three of these were placed under the coffin, the ends held by six men, and in this way the body was born to its last resting place. Old residents say that the first person to be buried there was a Dr. James Wilcox, but the first burial as shown by the inscription on the monument, was that of Robert Barr of Lexington, Ky., in 1821.

February 23, 1853, the Legislature passed an act authorizing cemetery associations, and in 1858, five years later, the Columbia Cemetery Association was organized. The association bought a piece of land adjoining the common burying ground on the west, from Jefferson Garth, the same year. This ground was laid off into cemetery lots, and many bodies were removed at this time from the common burying ground to the new cemetery. The grounds have been added to from time to time, until now the association owns 57 acres. A little over 25 years ago, the Council conveyed by deed the six old lots to the Columbia Cemetery Association, as authorized by

law, so that now the original common burying ground is a part of the present cemetery. The following April the ground forming the beautiful avenue leading from Broadway to the cemetery was also purchased from Mr. Garth. The original entrance to the cemetery was on Locust street.

Many distinguished persons are buried there; state senators, supreme court judges, W. W. Hudson, 1859 and John H. Lathrop 1866, presidents of the University of Missouri, a president of Christian College and of Stephens College, and acting governor Abraham J. Williams. There are unmarked graves; some marked by wooden crosses or plain slabs inscribed with only the name, date of birth and date of death; there are some with majestic monuments. The oldest person buried there, according to the monuments, is Margaret Bowling who died in 1894 at the age of 93 years.

The grounds are kept in attractive order by the association. Funds for the upkeep of the cemetery are derived from the sale of lots, and the perpetual care fund. Since 1916, purchasers of lots are required to pay from \$25 for a small lot to \$50 on a lot 16 by 32, into the fund. The interest on this money is used for the care of the lots. The fund now amounts to about \$7,000. There are now 13,000 graves, the same number as the population of Columbia. Of the total number of persons buried there, 9,105 are white and 4,095 are negroes. From 1916 to 1921 there were 800 burials.

East of the Columbia Cemetery is the Jewish Cemetery. It appears to be a part of the Columbia Cemetery because recently the inclosure around it was removed to give the whole a unified appearance.

dustrial organization which must before everything get means of production from the outside, including foodstuffs. But exportation has also started. The total exports to England for the first eleven months of this year through the Co-Operative Society have reached 1,130,000 pounds sterling, including 684,000 worth of timber, 122,000 of naphtha products, 202,000 of manganese mineral, 26,000 of copper and 9,000 worth of furs.

Argentina May Send Winter Fruit. Buenos Aires, Feb. 8.—Through the co-operation of the Department of Commerce, the Shipping Board and local American interests, efforts are being made to supply the United States in winter with fresh fruits, vegetables and other products of summer from Argentina. About the middle of February an official sample consignment consisting of five tons of selected peaches, plums and grapes will be shipped.
