NOTICE OF ANNUAL SCHOOL ELECTION. In compliance with Section 11251, Revised Statutes of Missouri, 1919, notice is hereby given to the qualified voters of the school district of Columbia, in the County of Boone and State of Missouri, that the annual school election will be held in said district on

TUESDAY, APRIL 4th, 1922, and that the following propositions will be submitted:

To elect two directors to serve for a period of three years.

To increase the annual rate of taxation (which is fixed by law at forty cents on the \$100 valuation) fifty-five (55) cents on the \$100 valuation for school purposes.

Said election will be held in conjunction with the city election of the City of Columbia, Missouri, at the same polling places and under direction of the same judges and clerks. Voters living outside said city will vote in that ward of said city to which they would be attached if the ward lines of said city were produced in straight lines throughout said territory to the limits of said district.
