THE SIOUX TREATY.

An Immense Acreage Thrown Open to White Settlers.

Chicago, December 2.—A Standing Rock special says the Sioux commissioners, after four councils with the Indians, Thursday afternoon secured the signatures required to an agreement, making the northern boundary of the reservation on the Cannon Ball river, the eastern boundary of the lower line of the Missouri river, the southern on the Grand river, the Western on the 102d meridian, making about sixty miles of river front. 3,500 Indians are here and 1,500 more are expected from the sitting Bull's band and Crow and Creek agencies. Each man, woman and child gets a cow. Aid will be given in building houses and machines furnished free for ten years, and the government maintains schools for twenty years. Annuitants continue till they become self supporting. A similar agreement was made with the Indians at Pine Ridge and Santee agencies and an immense acreage will be thus thrown open to white settlers.

A Baptist minister of Maryland, Tenn., declared that he had been restored to life after being dead three days, his return to the world being for the purpose of evangelizing it. His work, however, was stopped, because he undertook it naked, and he is now in an insane asylum.
