BRIGANDAGE IN POLAND.

Bold Outlaws Who Make Organized Attacks on Property Holders.

Vienna, Jan. 3.—The authorities at Warsaw are excited over the spread of brigandage in Russian Poland. The province of Radem, adjoining Austrian Galicia, has recently been infested by a band of 20 brigands, led by a notorious chief named Julian Voyte. These robbers attacked the residence of a wealthy landowner named Vetchkorovitch, who had refused to pay them blackmail. They slaughtered the live stock found on the place, and after plundering the house set fire to it. Vetchkorovitch himself succeeded in escaping from the house and took refuge on the roof of the barn where he remained unnoticed by robbers. Vetchkorovitch was badly burned in getting away from his house and suffered greatly while in concealment. Some of his employes carried word of the outrage to the authorities and on the following day a force of troops pursued the brigands in a forest and a sharp fight ensued. The robbers made a fierce resistance and wounded several of the soldiers, but the bandits were at length subdued and taken prisoners. The troops then made their way to the abode of Voyte, the robber leader. There they found a large quantity of stolen wealth, the place being fitted up in fine style. In the cellar of Voyte's house a man was found whom the robber chief was holding for ransom.

Another band of 16 masked brigands attacked the mansion of Baron Khovokh, near Alexandrov, about 60 miles west of Warsaw. A severe conflict ensued, the Baron, aided by his servants and by peasants from the estate making a brave resistance. Several persons were wounded on each side, but the bandits were at length repulsed.

A number of land owners in the neighborhood of Zavadra also have had their residences sacked by brigands.

SILVER LEGISLATION.

Mr. Bland Talks Pointedly in Favor of Free Coinage.

Washington, D. C., Dec. 30.—"I want no compromise. I am for free coinage of silver at the present ratio first last and all the time." Representative Bland the veteran silver leader and the chairman of the house committee on coinage, was very emphatic when he delivered himself of these statements this morning.

"I want no compromise at all, but if I could do no better I would probably accept the old act provided that the maximum amount, \$4,000,000 a month, mentioned in that measure is agreed to. I believe that the present law is the best legislation we have had in the interest of silver, and of course I do not want it repealed."

"What do you think of the prospects of silver legislation at this congress?"

"I am told that an attempt is to be made to repeal the present law."

"Well do you think this attempt will be successful?"

"No I do not. I don't think such a proposition can get through the house. I think, however, that there will be a better chance for it to pass at this session than there will be during the next congress. There are a number of men who have been re-elected and who vote independently of the wishes of their constituents, especially as a democratic administration will soon be inaugurated which is opposed to free coinage. I am for free coinage, and if I can not get it at this session I will try to secure it the next, or at the earliest possible moment. The Sherman law is the nearest we have been able to get to that point as yet. It is proposed to repeal it, but nothing is suggested to take its place. If that proposition carried silver would at once be demonetized and when that happens it will not be long till gold too is demonetized. With silver demonetized, there would be such a fight for gold among the nations, the highest bidder getting it, that panics would inevitably ensue. Then the people of this country would rise up and give the people such a lesson on finance they don't dream of. The eastern men who are clamorous for gold are too greedy and are grasping for everything in sight, letting the future take care of itself. They will soon find out their mistake. It is my belief that the world is rapidly drifting toward paper money. It will reach that point before long and I do not know but what we will be just as well off."

Amos Avery, convicted of murder in the first degree by the criminal court of Barton county and under sentence of death, last night attempted suicide by hanging in the county jail in this city, where he is confined for safe keeping.

Avery is subject to epileptic fits. He was stricken with a fit about 9 o'clock last night and was very violent. He was handcuffed and his feet tied with a light rope. About 9:30 Deputy Marshal Frank Stewart happened in the jail corridor between watches and heard groans coming from Avery's cell. He hastened to the place and found Avery hanging to the bars of his cell with the rope with which his feet had been tied around his neck. When cut down he had recovered from his fit and went quietly to bed.

Avery has been confined in the jail here since last March his case having been appealed to the supreme court. He murdered a farmer near Lamar, Mo., about fifteen months ago.


