"I would impress upon you that courtesy does not radiate from marble counters or massive steel vaults, nor in methods and system—it can come only from the personality of real live officers and employees. Every face behind the counter should display a pleasing disposition; every word spoken in the transaction of business must be tempered with a generous kindness; every complaint or misunderstanding must be treated in the spirit of fairness without any show of impatience or antagonism; and every action must disclose unadulterated sincerity.

"In the handling of loans, it is quite natural for the banker to become brusque and harsh, and all the time more conservative with a suggestion of suspicion, for he is continually sought by crooks and men with visionary schemes. But there are a great many different ways of saying 'No.' If said in a way to engender ill will, the applicant goes out and advertises the banker's attitude. Remember, a man who is turned down for a loan today, may turn up with a deposit tomorrow.

"It is said the wife can throw more out of the window with the spoon than the husband can rake in at the door with the shovel. So officers and clerks can drive away and actually kill more business by little discourteous acts and words than can possibly be raked in by all the advertising campaigns or by the influence of magnificent buildings and gorgeous furnishings.

"It is the friendship inspired and evolved from considerate courtesy that has given the banks of our country their large patronage. This type of courtesy means much to the stranger, for he naturally longs to be received pleasantly and treated kindly. You may be assured he is quick to note the cold, the formal, the forbearing, the arrogant attitude."

prescribing a penalty for the violation thereof of repealing all part of the Constitution, Statutes and Municipal Laws in conflict therewith.

Proposed amendment to the Constitution of Missouri, to be submitted to the legal voters of the State of Missouri for their approval or rejection at the regular general election to be held on the seventh day of November, A. D. 1916, prohibiting the manufacture of, the introduction into, and the giving, exchanging, bartering, selling, or disposing of intoxicating liquors in the State of Missouri, except wine for sacramental purposes, prescribing a penalty for the violation thereof and repealing all parts of the State Constitution, State and Municipal Laws in conflict therewith.

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Missouri:

Section 1. From and after July 1, 1917, no intoxicating liquor or liquors, except wine for sacramental purposes, shall be manufactured in or introduced into the State of Missouri under any pretense. Every person who sells, exchanges, gives, barter, or disposes of intoxicating liquor of any kind to any person in State of Missouri, or manufactures or introduce into or attempting to introduce into the State of Missouri, intoxicating liquor of any kind, except wine as aforesaid for the purposes aforesaid, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine of not less than three hundred dollars nor more than one thousand dollars, or by imprisonment in the county jail not less than six months nor more than twelve months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

All parts of the State Constitution, and laws of the State and municipalities therein, conflicting with the provisions of this section are hereby repealed.
