LET every republican interested in politics attend the primaries on April 26. If we have good primaries to select delegates there will be no doubt but that everything will pass off harmoniously.

THERE never was a greater demand for a strong, well balanced and well proportioned republican ticket than is called for this year. Let our nominating convention on May 3 keep this in mind.

MCPHEETERS, who has been county clerk of Scott county for twenty years, was re-elected last week at the primaries in that county over Phil A. Hafner. The people will hold on to an efficient man.

JUDGE BARTELS, presiding judge of the county court, has served one term. He may not announce for the office but will serve a second term if nominated and elected. He has made a good judge and if the party sees fit to again nominate him he will render the people good service.

JUDGE WM. P. THOMPSON has served our county one term as associate judge of the first district and will not ask for the office again, but will serve the party again in that capacity if nominated. He is the kind of a man to nominate and will receive the nomination. He ought to have it.

COL. G. C. THILENIUS, our present representative, has asked the people twice for the office he now holds, and it is now time for the party to ask him to serve another term. No man could do more in the legislature at this time than Col. Thilenius. He has influence and high standing with the present members of both houses, especially with those of the senate.

THE basis of representation to the state convention is fixed at one vote for every 300 or fraction of 150 or over cast for Wm. McKinley in 1900, and the basis for the judicial convention is one for every 500 or fraction of 250 or over cast for Wm. McKinley in 1900. That gives Cape Girardeau county nine delegates to the state convention and six to the judicial convention.

OF course, Mr. Paar, Mr. Koehler and Mr. Engelmann have held office for a number of years, and the people have had faith in their ability and have been satisfied with work. Now, if it is these gentlemen that the nominating convention say shall be our standard bearers we are satisfied, and if on the other hand their opponents are selected we will be satisfied with them.

IN the proper column will be found the announcement of L. F. Klostermann for presiding judge of the county court. Mr. Klostermann is certainly proper material for the place. He is a successful business man; has managed his business successfully for the past thirty-five or forty years, and that says he would be a safe man to manage the business of the county. He has represented this county in the legislature, and is known all over this county, and no doubt will be nominated on May 3. We feel sure that should Mr. Klostermann be nominated and elected that he would do justice to the people and the office.

R. M. SAWYER announces himself in this issue as a candidate for probate judge. Mr. Sawyer has all the necessary qualifications to fill the office, and should be the choice of the convention he will make a strong candidate. Mr. Sawyer comes from a family of staunch republicans, and no matter what has happened he has always been found voting the republican ticket, hence his friends, and he has no few of them, think that he should be honored with a county office. Mr. Sawyer is courteous, conscientious and careful, therefore would fill any office acceptably, that the people may give them.

OUR legislature has been democratic for many years, and for the past twelve years these same democrats have been fighting the normal schools and especially the appropriation for the southeast normal, hence it is all stuff about sending a man from this county to the legislature that is of the same belief as the majority of the house. We venture the assertion that J. J. Sawyer or Colonel G. C. Thilenius can get as large an appropriation for the rebuilding of the Cape normal as any democrat in the county, for they know how to do it.

THE democratic county central committee met in Jackson last Saturday and called off the primaries for congressman and senators. The township meetings to select delegates to the state, congressional and judicial conventions will be held May 24, and convention May 31.
