MUD IS CITY'S CHIEF STAPLE.

Houses and Utensils of Yezd Are Made of the Earth.

"One of the most extraordinary cities in the world is Yezd, in central Persia," writes a traveler. "It is situated in the midst of a vast salt desert which stretches for hundreds of miles in all directions. The nearest inhabited place of any size is Isfahan, and that is 200 miles away. The inhabitants of Yezd who have been away from Yezd during their lives number, perhaps, two or three score, and the bulk of these have not extended their travels further than Shiraz or Kirman in the one direction, or to Isfahan in the other. Yet between 50,000 and 60,000 people make the place their home. For ninety-nine out of every 100 of these the great outside world has not merely no interest—it has absolutely no existence at all.

"Yezd is a city made almost entirely out of mud. Not only are the houses built of this material, but the very furniture, the trepanns, the barrels for grain, the children's toys, the bread receptacles, even the beds, are simply mud, molded into a rough form and dried in the sun.

"In the Yezd shops the goods, mostly mud, are displayed on tiers of mud ledges, and there is a mud room behind. The bakers' ovens are of mud, down to the very doors. Many of the Yezdis even eat mud and develop an unwholesome muddy complexion in consequence."
