## Eight Thousand Free Homes

Opening of the Crow Indian Reservation to Settlement and Entry.

BILLINGS, MONT., May 9, 1906.  
The government of the United States will soon open to settlement over a million acres of the finest agricultural land in the West situated in the famous Yellowstone Valley, and which is the ceded portion of the Crow Indian Reservation. About 400,000 acres of this land will be irrigated by the government under the National Irrigation Law. Irrigation canals are being constructed and water will soon be available for the settlers. The preliminary arrangements for the opening, which are about completed, indicate that the opening will be on in full blast about June 1st.

Hundreds of people are already here, and it is estimated that at least 100,000 people will take part in the opening. It is the greatest opening of Indian lands yet disposed of by the government of the United States. Lands under the irrigation ditches are worth \$100.00 per acre, and there are 5000 eighty-acre tracts of this kind of land to be disposed of under the homestead and reclamation acts. Not only is the land so valuable for agricultural purposes, but several tracts are also sought for townsite purposes and it is said that \$50,000 has been offered to the person drawing No. 1 for townsite purposes. The land will be disposed of under the drawing or lottery system.

The Billings & Great Falls railroad and the Milwaukee railroad want hundreds of men to work in the different construction departments, and there is a great demand for carpenters and all building trades to work on the Billings sugar factory and other buildings in course of construction in Billings. Contractors who are constructing the canals on the reservation want hundreds of teamsters and laborers. People are coming here every day and inquiring concerning the Crow Reservation from throughout the United States.

Mr. C. L. Harris, attorney at law of this city, has opened a free information bureau, and all persons who desire information concerning the country or the Crow Reservation can obtain the same free of charge by addressing him at this place.
