Tiptonville (Tenn.) News: Attorney-General Charles T. Cates, Jr., will in all probability file a bill Monday to clear up the state's title to Reelfoot lake. A conference to this end was held in the Maxwell House yesterday between Gen. Cates, Associate Counsel D. B. Puyear of Gallatin and H. H. Barr of Dresden. The bill will be against the West Tennessee Land Company, the present owner of the Reelfoot lake property, and all other claimants to title or interest in the same. A suit may be instituted by the state later to set apart and establish Reelfoot as a common fishery and game preserve for the people of Tennessee, in which case condemnation proceeding will have to be instituted. The entire situation was discussed at a conference recently held in Memphis, in which the governor, Gen. Cates and counsel for the West Tennessee Land Company participated, at which the present mode of procedure was mapped out.
